New York Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market celebrated Veterans Day Thursday with a strong advance that sent it to the fourth straight new 25-year high.

Volume came to 2,960,000 shares. Panhandle Oil, Wednesday's second most active issue up 1-2, was at the top of the most active list Thursday up 1-4 at 9. Next came Chrysler off 1 at 63 7-8. Remington Rand up 3 7-8 at 36 3-8. Canadian Pacific up 1-4 at 28 7-8 and New York Central up 1-2 at 22 1-2.

Except for Canadian Pacific, Canadian issues tended lower. Dairymen-Seagraves and Dome mines each lost 1-4.

Among other stocks advancing with net gains were Montgomery Ward up 1 3-8. Caterpillar Tractor, 1 Western Union 3, American Telephone 3-8. Corning Glass 8, Ingersoll-Rand 5, Union Pacific 3, Texas Company 1 5-8, Houston Oil 6 1-4. Johns-Manville 1, and Standard Oil of California 2 1-8.

Among losers were North American Aviation 3-4, Admiral Corp. 1-2, Columbia Broadcasting "A" 2, American Woolen 1, American Can 1-2, Studebaker-Packard 3-8.

Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP)—The stock market stumbled through some light selling Thursday but regained its 20-year high at the close.

Only steels closed lower. Low-priced mines were active and although the overall trend was easier several issues bounced well ahead. Wilroy climbed 60 cents after drilling reports from its Manitowadge property and Consolidated Hovey, with an interest in Wilroy, climbed 15 cents.

Pacific Eastern traded 300,000 shares in the first 20 minutes after the company reported its intention to sell up to that number of shares at not less than 10 cents a share. The issue closed at 15 cents for a three-cent climb on 489,000 share turnover in the session.

Other strong issues were Cunair up 1/2, Bathurst Mining 1/4 and Maritimes Mining up 20. Consolidated Denison hit a 1954 high of \$1.38, easing later for a seven-cent climb on the day.

MONTREAL (CP)—Prices were mixed at the close of moderately active trading on the stock market Thursday.

Donohue advanced 1 1/4 points and CPR was 1 1/4 stronger. Ford, Weston and Great Lakes Paper each gained 3/4 point while Power Corporation was 1/2 better. Half-point advances were made by P. E. Brothers, Bank of Montreal and Canadian Vickers. Imperial Oil improved 3/4 point. Aluminium arri Stelco each firm 1/4.

Canada Cement was down 3 1/2 points while Bathurst B and G. Aneau each slipped 1/2. Noranda, Shawanigan and Industrial Acceptance were each off 1/2 point. Down 1/4 were International Nickel A, McColl, Algoma Steel and Abitibi. Canadian Industries and Famous Players eased minor fractions.

Papers leaned forward and carriers and banks were slightly stronger. Other sections of the industrial market were narrowly mixed.

Mines displayed an irregular pattern with Wilroy climbing 95 cents and Lorado off 15 cents. Meta was off 9 cents. Western oils were mixed in a 10-cent range.
