

# Next Quebec Premier Is Family Man, Hunter

QUEBEC (CP)—The man expected to become Quebec's new premier in a few days is a family man, veteran of the Second World War and an ardent hunter who keeps fine hunting hounds and lives in a white-painted frame house at St. Eustache, near Montreal.

Hon. Paul Sauve, youth and social welfare minister, is a political prodigy and like the late Premier Duplessis was raised in a home where politics was the chief subject of conversation.

He was elected a member of the Quebec legislature at 23—the year he graduated as a lawyer—and at 29 was speaker of the legislative assembly—a post usually held by a member of more mature years. He has been in the Quebec cabinet since 1946.

He has been member for Two Mountains riding for 26 years, holding his seat in the general election of 1944 while he was officer commanding the Fusiliers Mont-Royal regiment in the Londe forests of Normandy.

WIFE AIDS CAMPAIGN  
His wife, tall attractive mother of three, toured the riding for him and he won handily over his Liberal opponent.

By the 1956 provincial election he was already playing a key role in the Union Nationale party's affairs and was emerging as Mr. Duplessis' second-in-command.

That election campaign left its mark on Mr. Duplessis. The indefatigable political warrior, then 66, had burned up the hustings like a man of 40.

During the annual legislature sessions that followed, he missed a few days and Mr. Sauve stepped up to lead the government benches in the premier's absence.

Gradually, because he wanted to avoid at all cost the impression he was overhauling his cabinet, Mr. Duplessis brought in new cabinet ministers. All were men backing Mr. Sauve, who looked like the designated heir to the Union Nationale succession.

ON RIGHT HAND  
When finance minister Onesime Gagnon resigned and later was appointed lieutenant-governor, Mr. Sauve moved to his desk in the legislative assembly—a symbolic seat at the righthand side of the premier reserved for the senior cabinet minister.

During the last session, Mr. Sauve led the house in several debates against the Liberal opposition and for the first time—although briefly—took over the premier's seat in the house committees.

When news of the premier's fatal illness spread, Mr. Sauve received a number of cabinet ministers at his hotel room. He issued a statement on behalf of the ministers when Mr. Duplessis' death was announced.

Early Monday, when he entered the airport terminal where the cabinet members waited for the arrival of Mr. Duplessis' body, other ministers stood to greet Mr. Sauve. He appeared to have the full support of the cabinet.

MET MINISTERS  
Mr. Sauve and a number of ministers have already met privately with Lieutenant-Governor Gagnon but no full meeting of the cabinet is expected until the funeral service at Trois-Rivieres Thursday.

Mr. Sauve, natty, well-mannered, looks like the product of the big city. But he was born in village of St. Benoit, in one of the oldest farming areas near Montreal, his ancestors of Quebec farm stock.

Arthur Sauve, his father, was a newspaper man, gentleman farmer, and as a prominent political figure with Quebec's Conservative opposition leader. He later became a member of the

House of Commons and postmaster general in the federal cabinet. In 1935 he was appointed to the Ottawa Senate where he represented Rigaud division until 1944.

LOST IN 1935  
The young Sauve was defeated in the 1935 provincial election but gained his place in the legislature during the turbulent 1936 provincial election when Mr. Duplessis' Union Nationale swept the province for the first time.

Mr. and Mrs. Sauve have three children, Luce-Paule, Pierre and Ginette.

As a youth, Mr. Sauve was an ardent tennis player. Today his favorite relaxations are hunting, fishing and golf.

## Some 400 Die On U.S. Roads

CHICAGO (AP)—Accidental deaths in the United States passed the 500 mark Monday night with traffic accidents accounting for nearly 400 deaths as the three-day Labor Day weekend drew to a close.

With the death count clicking off at more than five an hour during most of the 72-hour period, the National Safety Council warned of a possible record for the holiday.

At 10 p.m. EDT, traffic deaths tallied 378. Sixty-six were drowned in boating and non-boating accidents while 65 others died from miscellaneous causes for a total of 509.

The council estimated 450 traffic deaths during the period from 6 p.m. local time Friday to midnight Monday.

The record Labor Day count was in 1951, when 461 died in highway crashes.

## Halifax Child Drowning Victim

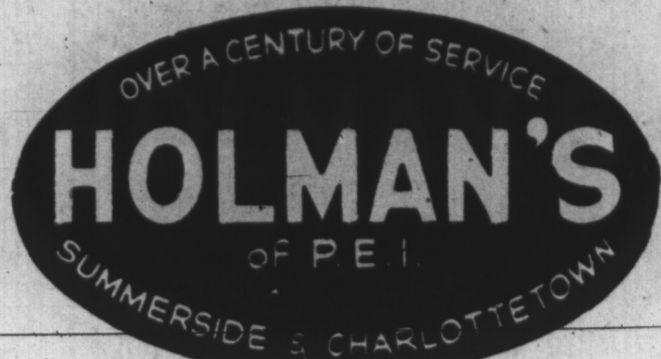
