THE Grits were accustomed to sneer, last Parliamentary session, at the efforts which were being made by the Government to obtain more intimate commercial relations with Spain and her colonies. But while these political do-nothings ridiculed any proposition to increase our trade with Cuba, the Americans are vigorously endeavoring to secure concessions which will enable them to send in their products. They complain that while importations of sugar to the United States from Cuba amount to \$50,000,000, the exports of American flour amount to only \$300,000, although the Spanish islands consume twelve million dollars' worth. It is believed that the United States Government can obtain important concessions from Spain by reducing the duty on sugars imported from Cuba and Porto Rico.—*Mail*.

Supreme Court.

THE COURT met at 11 o'clock to-day. In the case of the *Queen* at the prosecution of John F. McKay vs. Cathrine Lannan, Ellen Lannan and Jane McInnis, the Grand Jury returned a true bill for larceny against Ellen Lannan and Jane McInnis but not against Cathrine Lannan. A true bill was also found against Frederick Davy for assault. In the case of David Hooper against Samuel Coles, an absent debtor, the Jury returned a verdict of \$80 for the plaintiff. The case now before the Court is the *Summerside Bank vs. James E. Morrissey*, an action on a note of hand.
