A BANK AND A PROVINCE ROBBED.—It cost the Bank of Nova Scotia twenty-three thousand dollars and the Province of Nova Scotia nearly a thousand, to enable the officials to see Barnum's circus procession. The procession came up Hollis street and turned up George street. Everybody rushed out to see it. Among the number were the clerks of the Provincial Treasurer's office, Provincial Building, who looked the door after them. While they were out the building was entered by a thief, who burst open the door of the Treasurer's private office, passed into the clerks' office and carried off the cash box containing \$993 and some valuable papers. It is supposed that he left by the Granville street side of the building. How he managed to carry away the cash box without being seen is a mystery. At the Bank of Nova Scotia, a few steps further north, on Hollis street, the operation was carried out on a much larger scale. The Bank is a few steps north of George street, up which the procession was turning. The bank officials locked the doors and all came over to the corner to see the show. A man rang the bell of the side door and told the messenger's wife, who responded to the ring, that he had dropped an important paper down the grating and wanted to go to the cellar to get it. She said she could not, but he pushed her aside and went below, passed up into the bank, swept the counter of \$23,000, came out through the directors' room and quietly escaped. The whole thing was done so quickly that it was over before the woman comprehended what was going on. Detectives were immediately put on the track. To-night two men were arrested at Bedford on suspicion. They took a cab in the city soon after the robberies, drove to Richmond where they took another cab and drove to Bedford. It is believed they are the men, but there is no direct proof yet. The bank of Nova Scotia offers a reward of \$1,000 for the arrest of the thief, and \$2,000 for the recovery of the money.
