### N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market was pointed down Tuesday by a selling wave centred in aircrafts as the Russians changed premiers.

Losses in some instances were severe with the decline extended to between 1 and 3 points. A goodly number of gains remained despite the selloff, some going to around 2 points.

Aircrafts presented a mixed price picture while the rest of the market was somewhat lower.

The Russian change of prime ministers from Malenkov to Bulganin and the belittled words of Foreign Minister Molotov was the basic cause for the market's performance, brokers agreed, but they were at a loss to explain the sudden weakness in the aircrafts late in the day.

Aircrafts, of course, have been strong in recent days while the tension has been building up over the Formosan situation, and any selloff would not have been unexpected.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks fell \$1.40, the fourth largest decline this year. Volume amounted to 3,400,000 shares.

### EXCEPTION TO FALL

An outstanding exception to the fall was American Telephone up 1 1/2 at 179 1/2 after hitting a high of 108 1/2.

Many mining shares were strong and quite active. Rubbers were usually higher. But down with the aircrafts were steels, railroads, oils, chemicals, and most other major divisions.

Curtiss-Wright was the day's most active issue of 1 1/2 at 21 1/2. It was followed by Electric Musical Industries off 1/4 at 4 1/2, Fairchild Engine off 1/4 at 4 1/2, Calumet and Hecla up 1/4 at 13, and Avco Mfg. off 1/4 at 6 1/2.

Canadian issues were mixed. Dome Mines and International Nickel were both up 1/4, and McIntyre advanced 1/4. Canadian Pacific fell 1/4 and Distillers Seagram slipped 1/4.

On the American stock exchange Canadian issues were mixed. Giant Yellowknife added 1/4 while Lake Shore fell 1/4. Royalty Oil remained unchanged.

### Montreal Stocks

MONTREAL (CP)—Losses ranged to more than a point as the stock market slipped lower in active trading Tuesday.

General Dynamics fell 3/4 at 92 1/2 and Aluminium dropped 2 1/2 at 74 1/2. Canadian Vickers was off 1 1/2 at 36 1/2 while Ford, Minnesota and Ontario each dipped 1 1/2 at 103 1/2 and 53 1/2, respectively.

Miscellaneous industries, papers and senior metals suffered the heaviest losses. Other sections of the industrial market were fractionally lower.

Cassiar advanced 20 cents at \$8.45 and Rix Athabaska improved 14 cents at \$1.49 in a mixed mine section. Sullivan was off 20 cents at \$5.30 and East Sullivan at \$5.10 was 10 cents easier.

Western oils retreated with Scurry off 69 cents at \$2.23 and Calvan off 20 cents at \$5.65.

### Toronto Stocks

TORONTO (CP)—A heavy wave of selling rolled over the stock market just before Tuesday's close resulting in the sharpest price break in more than a month.

Many investors were trying to decide what to do as a result of the change of government in Moscow.

Falconbridge, off 1/2, led base metals down. Consolidated Smelters lost a major fraction.

A long list of western oils declined with drops as great as 35 cents. Weak stocks included Merril, Peruvian, Scurry, Triand, Western Lashcoils, Home Oil, Great Sweet Grass, Federated Pets and Calvan.

Teck-Hughes dropped 70 cents to \$3.70 to lead golds down. Preston fell 35 to \$6.65 and Lake Shore 20 to \$5.95. Also weak were Lamaque, Sullivan and Wright-Hargreaves.

Most uraniums eased after their booming strength Monday. Giant dropped \$1.25 to \$14.75 and the warrants 75 cents to \$7.50. Lorado 35 to \$3.50 and Algom 25 to \$15.75. Faraday, Consolidated Denison Chimo, Beaucage and Coulee were also lower. The few strong mining issues included Anacon and Baska.
