Employment Picture Brighter In September, Gov't Reports

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada's unemployment picture brightened a trifle in September, but it remained considerably gloomier than a year earlier.

There were 271,000 unemployed and looking for work at Sept. 20, the government estimated Tuesday. This was 10,000 fewer than a month earlier.

In September of last year — when the country was heading into the heaviest cold weather unemployment since the war — there were just 197,000 unemployed, about one-third less than the latest total.

The new figures would appear to indicate—at least on a statistical basis—that Canada could be heading into its second successive post-war unemployment peak. The top of 590,000 came last March.

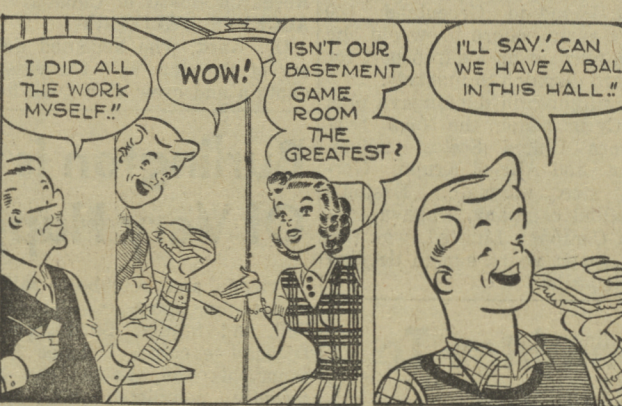
Crossword puzzle grid with clues for Across and Down words.

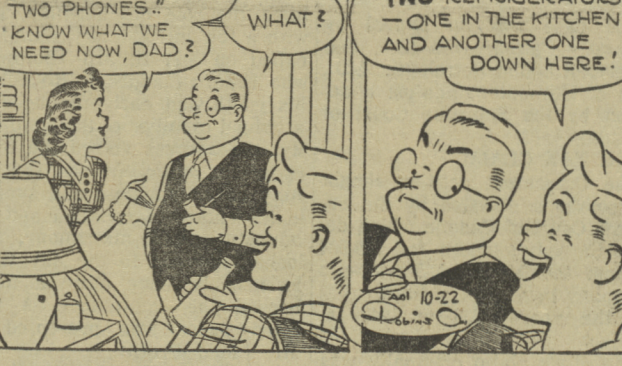
