Vernon And Schoendienst Lead Batting Races

NEW YORK, (AP)—Washington's Mickey Vernon and Red Schoendienst of the St. Louis Cardinals, both second in their respective circuits a week ago, have scooped back into the lead in the topsy-turvy major league batting races.
With the teams entering the final month of play, Vernon displaced Al Rosen of the Cleveland Indians as the American League's top batter with a .328 average. In the National League Schoendienst boosted his average to .340 to regain the front-running position from Monte Irvin of the New York Giants.
Vernon, who won the batting crown in 1946, went 11-for-30 and gained three points. Rosen, meanwhile, slipped from the top spot to second at .325. He lost one point in going 9-for-28. Figures include Sunday's games.
Orestes Minnie Minoes of the Chicago White Sox remains third with .315. The fleet outfielder collected six hits in 23 at bats and suffered a three-point decline.
Schoendienst and Irvin, both seeing limited action because of ankle injuries, exchanged places in the National League hitting list. Irvin went 1-for-2 for a one-point hike, but he relinquished his lead and trails Schoendienst at .339.
Brooklyn's Carl Furillo, in third with .335, continued his steady winging by going 13-for-27.
Rosen is setting the American League pace in runs batted in with 22 and is tied with Gus Zernial of the A's for home runs supremacy with 35 apiece. In the National League Campanella is tops in the RBI department with 122 and Milwaukee's Eddie Mathews is way out in front in home run production with 43.

Atlantic Provinces Well Represented At Track Meet

TORONTO, (CP)—Atlantic provinces were well represented at the opening of the Canadian Olympic training plan track and field school Monday at the Canadian National Exhibition.
Prince Edward Island has no team here but 29 athletes and coaches have come from New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland. In all 150-odd representing nine provinces are attending the school.
Lectures on sprints, relays and high jumping were given by Don Canham, track and field coach at Michigan University, and Bruce Hummer of Victoria, B.C., coach of Canada's teams in the last Olympic and British Empire games.
Canham told the assembled athletes that lack of pre-season training was the big factor hampering Canadian track and field.
Rev. Bob Roelands of Long Beach Calif., the world's champion pole vaulter will arrive Wednesday to join the coaching staff.
Wes Sarty, well known United States miler, is also expected to give a talk during the week.
The training plan is being built around the youth of the country and the school will be held for four years, costing an estimated \$80,000.
Following the four-day school the Canadian inter-provincial track and field championships will be held. Newfoundland has four athletes, Nova Scotia nine and New Brunswick 12.
The athletes worked out on the exhibition track following the lectures. Canham looking over the sprinters, remarked on the almost perfect form of Bill Haley and Jim Warner, two Halifax Wanderers Club sprinters.

Turk Broda Signs As Ottawa Senators' Coach

OTTAWA, (CP)—Big Turk Broda, lining up his second season of hockey since retiring as netminder for Toronto Maple Leafs, inked a one-year contract as coach of Ottawa Senators of the Quebec Senior Hockey League Monday.
The Turk said he currently weighs "210 pounds, soaking wet", and with Ottawa sweltering in an over-90 degree heat wave, that's how he was when he dropped into T. P. Gorman's office at the auditing firm.
Broda won't play for Ottawa, Gorman said. His contract, for an undisclosed sum, covers coaching duties only.
He replaces Johnny O'Flaheerty, who has gone to Sault Ste. Marie. While Gorman was definite about Broda not playing nets for Senators, the Turk dodged reporters' questions on this point.
"Well," he grinned, "I honestly don't know. All I can say is I'll be in shape by the time the hockey season opens."
Meanwhile, Gorman had his men starting to make ice in the auditorium. Senators will hold their practice Sept. 19, and hold exhibition games against Buffalo Bisons, Toronto Maple Leafs and Chicago Black Hawks Sept. 26, Sept. 30, and Oct. 3 respectively. They open the regular season Oct. 10.
