Canadian Woman Held At Gunpoint

WINCHESTER, Va. (AP) — A Canadian woman and a college graduate student from Waies were robbed and held at gunpoint for more than six hours early Monday by a couple who were sharing a ride from Canada to Florida.

They left Toronto Sunday morning, she said, and she drove all day. Sunday night, she said, the man took over the wheel and she and Rees sat in the back seat. About half way between Washington, D.C., and Winchester in northern Virginia, she said, the man stopped the car, pulled a pistol and said: "we're going west."
