Supreme Court Jury Disagrees

A Supreme Court jury disagreed six-six yesterday when they sat in judgment for more than three hours on the case of Douglas Aretas Smith, charged with causing bodily harm by operation of a motor vehicle. The jury was discharged by Mr. Justice A. E. Arsenault presiding judge. The case arose out of an accident on the road last winter in which Bertie LeClair, 15-year-old Charlottetown girl was seriously injured. Evidence was heard last week and the case summed up for the defence by the Crown and by the presiding judge when the Court resumed yesterday morning.

BAKED FISH Select an oily meated variety of fish weighing from 3 to 5 pounds, clean and scale, removing the fins with scissors. Rub the inside of the fish with salt, sew up the cavity and place the fish in a well oiled baking pan. Brush all back up in a well oiled place in a hot oven over with cooking oil and place in the heat (500 deg. Fahr.) for 10 minutes or until the fish begins to brown. Reduce the heat to about 350 deg. and continue to bake for 30 to 45 minutes—depending on the thickness of the fish. Chill and serve cold with lettuce, parsley and eggs stuffed with sardines.
