THE ANT AS DAIRYMAN

THE PECULIAR HABITS OF A CERTAIN SPECIES AT DEMERARA.

How They Stand as Foster-Parents to the Young of Tree-hoppers—An Organization of Insects Which Partakes of Human Intelligence—An Interesting Study.

Dr. Lewis Johnson, now engaged in exploration work for a European in some of the mountainous districts of British Guiana, describes certain peculiar ants observed by him there. It is long known that many species of ants made even of the larvae of certain plants and even of some higher tree-hoppers. But it seems that certain tree-hoppers also supply the ant with the "milk" or viscid secretion, and in exchange for which he is so willing to render his help, he confers the advantages of his aggressive protection.

A certain species of sweat-sap tree is infested by these tree hoppers, the female laying her eggs in tiny, cottony cinerous on the under side of the leaves and then standing outside of them on guard until they are hatched, after which their nurture and safety can be seen to the always present ant. The young tree hoppers are soft bodied, like little creatures, looking not unlike the ordinary plant-lice, so common on our Northern shrubs, and from one of the rear segments of their bodies there are, from time to time, exuded almost microscopic drops of a pale, sticky, sweetish, gummy fluid, which has an exceedingly sweet and wild-honey like taste. To obtain this fluid, there were constantly at hand a number of ants. So soon as the gummy drops were emitted, the ants, which were constantly arriving, came, those already on guard, although but a moment before showing much eagerness to possess themselves of these honey drops, presently relinquished their post, and retired to some distance, the ant being well informed, you will not seek any substitute if offered.

The Time Required.

With a well-balanced feed, 90 days is ample time in which to prepare an animal for market. Where the more nutritious foods were used, nearly as good daily gains can be made by mixing the grain with cut corn fodder, as though hay were used, and this may make the difference of a profit instead of a loss. Fifty per cent more manure is made from the animals receiving the well-balanced ration, and the manure is also much richer in plant food.

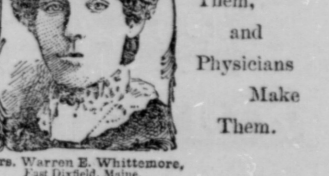
