

The Canada Gazette contains the following militia general orders: "In order that expenditure for drill, etc., for 1883-4 may be kept within the appropriation, the following limitation in the strength of the paid corps is made: Corps of Infantry and Garrison Artillery will not exceed 42 men, commissioned officers and men per company and battery including regimental staff-sergeants and bandmen. Field Batteries—One Captain two 1st Lieutenants, one 2nd Lieut., one surgeon, one Veterinary Surgeon, one Sergt.-Major, one Quartermaster-Sergt., four Sergeants, four Corporals, four Bombardiers, one Trumpeter, one Farrier, fifty-eight Gunners and Drivers and 29 horses, including officers' and non-commissioned officers' horses, City Corps are permitted to perform their 12 days drill at any time prior to December 1st, 1883, that is most convenient." The following will be the staff of each camp of exercises: The Command—Deputy-Adjutant-General of the District; One Brigade-Major, one assistant Brigade Major, with subaltern's pay; one Supply Officer, one Camp Quartermaster, one Medical Officer, one Instructor of Musketry, one Orderly, and one provost Officer, and five staff non-commissioned officers. Troops of cavalry are restricted to 35 horses each for pay.

A late dispatch from London, states that just before a steamer plying between Liverpool and New York left Liverpool on her last voyage, carrying a number of emigrants, a man gave the steward a box, requesting him to convey it to New York. The steward's suspicions were aroused, and he consulted the captain who ordered the box to be opened. The box contained an infernal machine. The contents were thrown overboard, but the box was retained, and the address upon it noted. The discovery was not publicly made known in New York on the vessel's arrival there, but the British Consul-General there was notified. The steamer had just returned from New York.

LATER.—It is supposed the *Britannic* was the steamer on which the attempt was made with the infernal machine. The British consul at New York, and the agents of leading steamship lines discredit the story from London about the alleged attempt to destroy an ocean steamer by means of an infernal machine.

Don't kill the crow. It is only within a few years that speakers at the various meetings had the courage to say a word for the crow, but now it is admitted that his character is not so uniformly black as his plumage. In Northern gardens, the white grub is, on the whole, the most injurious insect, when we consider the great variety of plants it attacks, ranging from grass to nursery trees, and that its work, being beneath the surface, is not suspected until the injury is done. The crow has a keener sense that allows him to detect the unseen presence of the white grub, and a fondness for a fat morsel that induces him to capture it. A few years ago, we had a chance to watch the operations of an assemblage of crows on a grub-infested lawn. Their skill in finding and dislodging the grub should have been witnessed by all opponents of the crow.—*American Agriculturist* for May.

Talmage lately preached against hypocrisy of all sorts. Practical religion, he said, will drive out all dishonesty. It will go to the hypocritical professors of religion who corner the corn market in Chicago, the men who make a fortune of millions out of the miseries of their fellowmen and then try to fix it up with the Lord by founding a church a university, or an hospital. They think the Lord will be so pleased if they give Him a part of the swindle. Their liturgy ought to be this:—"O Lord, we, by making corners in bread-stuffs and swindling for years, have ten millions of dollars. Thou knowest it was a scaly job; but it was smart. Now we would like to compromise with Thee at one per cent. of the profits. You can build an asylum for these poor miserable weaklings that suffer, and we will take a yacht and go to Europe. Forever and ever. Amen."

Nearly all the tradesmen of Dublin have received a circular termed "An analysis of the special juries on eighteen trials under the crimes act." Enclosed with the circular was a slip containing the words "Woe to you if you have any goods of these juries, for you and likewise they will have the blood and suffering of innocent people on your heads." The slip is signed "By hook or by crook." A sensation has been caused by this latest movement on the part of the friends of the Irish prisoner.

A wreath of flowers was received by Brady on the day before his death to which was attached a card bearing an expression of grief at his fate from Irishmen living in Liverpool. Brady made no statement to the jail chaplain or to the Governor of the prison. One of the last things he did was to write a letter to his mother. He carried a prayer book in his hand to the scaffold and was thoroughly resigned and firm. His body fell nine feet and death was instantaneous.
