

Contradictory Reports Mark Indian Food Crisis

NEW DELHI (AP)—You find cruel poverty, malnutrition and disease in India today. It has been much the same for as long as Indians can remember. You see no famine or any readily apparent sign that starvation is around the corner.

Associated Press reporters who travelled through India for three weeks found the situation much as Indian officials are now trying to depict it. There have been many contradictory reports in New Delhi on the food situation, coupled with a lack of solid statistics. Part of the conflict over food may derive from India's duality of character — the nation needs foreign food but many Indians are embarrassed to be in the position of having to accept gifts from other nations. Nearly 1,000,000 tons of U.S. wheat comes to India every month. But there is no question that there is hunger in India. Many children are underfed. Their thin arms and bleary eyes reveal lurking diseases that thrive on malnutrition. And there is no question that India is in ferment. From the southern peninsula to the northwest desert, the political pot is boiling and New Delhi's authority is being questioned. In some areas the red banner of revolution flies high. Separatist Political Party Is Being Formed In Quebec

QUEBEC (CP) — Formation of a new provincial political party to campaign for the sovereignty of Quebec was announced here. Still nameless and leaderless, its founders are elements of the Quebec wing of Le Ralliement des Creditistes and the separatist regroupement Nationaliste.

The move follows weekend conventions of the two parties during which the executives of the two voted on the alliance. The Union Nationale was earlier reported interested in the new party, but party founders said talks with Union Nationale Leader Daniel Johnson proved fruitless.

Announcement of the new party was made Sunday at a joint press conference by Laurent Legault, former provincial president of the Creditistes, and Regroupement President Dr. Rene Jutra, an avowed separatist.

The party will seek what is described as an "associate state" status for Quebec, under which the province would issue its own currency through a bank of Quebec and have absolute control over credit and the money supply.

Also in the party's campaign platform for the next provincial election is absolute control by Quebec of its immigration, resources, imports and exports, and external affairs.

The leaders said the party will field candidates in all 108 Quebec ridings in the impending provincial elections but a leader will not be selected until after the elections.

A name will be given the party at a convention in Montreal on the weekend of March 26.

Until the election of a leader, Mr. Legault and Dr. Jutra will head the party.

Pulp, Paper Probe Urged

TORONTO (CP) — John Baset, publisher of The Telegram says it is time for the government to undertake an inquiry into the whole pulp and paper industry in the face of rising newspaper prices.

He said in a signed article in The Telegram the recently-announced increase of \$10 a ton in the price of newsprint "will place a heavy burden on Canadian daily newspapers, and based on the published profits of the main newsprint companies, cannot be justified."

Mr. Baset said a few businesses since the Second World War have been able to load their customers with a corresponding increase that rates with the newsprint companies' series of increases to \$144 from \$60 a ton since 1945.

Opening lead—four of spades. Far be it from me to foist my views upon an unwilling public but I have had a theory for 10! these many years which finds little support among the players I know.

It is my contention that there's no such animal as a brilliant bridge player. But before the bricks are cast flying this way, let me explain what I mean.

Bridge is a game of reasoning and logic. There are other factors, no doubt, but basically the player who thinks soundly is the one who winds up with the dough.

If a bid or a play is correct in a given situation, then how can it be brilliant? A hand may be well bid or well played, but from the standpoint of art, that is expected, and the player who meets that expectation deserves no special credit.

Sometimes a player makes the wrong bid or play and it comes out right. If this player makes wrong bids or plays repeatedly, he is working against percentage and the odds will eventually catch up with him.

But if his occasional triumph can be classed as brilliance, then I want no part of it. Take today's hand. West led a spade which East won with the ace. South playing the king on it. East naturally assumed that the king was a singleton, and, mindful of dummy's jack of spades, shifted to a club. Had South played the three of spades on the opening lead, East undoubtedly would have returned a spade for West to ruff and South would have gone down one.

I admire South's play all right. East was marked by the bidding with six spades, and a ruff was therefore imminent. By dropping the king, South thought he might fool East and thus save a trick — which he did. But brilliant? No. South made the right play, that's all.
