OTTAWA—For an hour and 52 minutes the other day, members of the Commons aired their beefs about Parliament. A stranger listening to them would gather that they were 262 overworked, underpaid johnnies-put-upon, that what they did went unappreciated, and that all in all, being an MP was a dog's life.

But those of us who know them well, who have watched them from the press gallery year in and year out, who have eaten with them, drunk with them and joined in their bull sessions, know that not more than the smallest handful would rather be elsewhere than in Parliament.

Politics, like journalism, gets into one's blood. For MP's, the friendships, the camaraderie of the Commons, counts heavily. Then, even if a man's only a back-bencher, there's the satisfaction of being in the middle of important events, of watching and sharing Parliament's decisions, of being on a first name basis with the nation's leaders. And that aside altogether from the serious satisfaction of service.

Few MP's retire voluntarily. They're defeated, or they die in harness. The occasional one quits because of ill health, or because he has to think of his family's future in financial terms far beyond the \$6,000 a year that MP's get. But such an exception always leaves with regret.

However, the hard-boiled, realistic politicians who make up Parliament seldom get sentimental about their work, except on those rare occasions when someone is making a farewell speech. The records show that a year seldom passes without some of the members, particularly those in the Opposition, complaining about the way Parliament conducts the nation's business. Other MP's talk too much, they charge. Everybody wastes time. Committees don't function. The Government deliberately delays legislation so members won't debate it lengthily late in the session. There are perennial beefs.

This year the complaints have been louder than ever—partly because some MP's don't want to return to Ottawa for another session next fall, despite the fact they'll draw additional money for it. Typical comments, for example, have been: "Progressive Conservative Leader George Drew: 'If the members of this House are in fact to be called upon to sit throughout the best part of the year, as they have before, then many of them will have to revise their opinions

to the majority of us although some may be disregarded by those with 'cast iron' stomachs. Three meals a day at regular times and intervals (four to six hours apart) of about equal quantity. It is usually best to make the midday meal somewhat lighter where the schedule of the day calls for active mental work in the afternoon and for relaxation in the evening. Do not eat between meals. Do not eat within two hours of going to bed. Do not eat too many kinds of food at one meal or eat too much of some favorite food. If you know that a certain food is hard to digest, take a small amount of it and make the rest of the meal more easily digested foods. If your digestion is out of order for any reason, or if you are under unusual circumstances of strain or fatigue, take only liquid foods or small amounts of very easily digested foods until the difficulties is righted. Eat slowly. Enjoy your food and chew it well but do not get fussy about food nor think too much about how it will affect you. Cultivate a cheerful frame of mind as well as peaceful and pleasant relations at mealtimes.

RULES FOR PROMOTING GOOD DIGESTION It is known that about 15 per cent of the population is allergic or oversensitive to various substances—foods, furs, feathers, dusts, pollen—as these substances cause definite symptoms such as skin rashes and head colds. It is known also that some individuals cannot eat certain foods because at one time when they were eating this food they had just received bad news, were overtired or some other emotional disturbance was present. This so interfered with digestion that food remained in the stomach for a long period and digestion in the small intestine was greatly delayed. Thereafter, each time they think of this particular food the memory of their symptoms immediately takes away the desire for it. This is called "association of ideas" and accounts for many cases of digestive disturbance when the individual is not really allergic to the food eaten. In addition to those afflicted with allergy and association of ideas, there are even more individuals who do not use their knowledge of digestion or their common sense, and wonder why they have indigestion, perhaps ulcer, or even cancer.

I have written before of the rules for promoting good digestion as outlined by Dr. Jean Bogart in her book "Nutrition and Physical Fitness." Most of these rules apply
