PETITION TO THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL.

The following is the petition to the Governor-General to which reference has been made:

"To His Excellency the Earl of Minto, Governor-General of Canada, etc.:

"We the undersigned loyal subjects of Her Majesty, beg to approach Your Excellency and to present our humble petition as follows:

"That in the year 1896 the Right Hon. Sir Wilfrid Laurier, G. C. M. G., was chosen as the Prime Minister of Your Excellency's predecessor, and has held that high office until the present day.

"That during the period in which the Right Hon. Sir Wilfrid has been Your Excellency's adviser, numerous appointments of dignity and emolument have been made, including appointments to the Honourable the Senate of Canada.

"That it has been rumoured that in respect of some of these appointments persons representing Your Excellency's advisers have collected from the appointees sums of money as the price for the advice given to Your Excellency to issue Her Majesty's commission to these gentlemen. That a statement lending colour to these rumours have been made by one of the leading supporters of the Right Hon. Sir Wilfrid Laurier in the general elections of 1896.

"That the same statement declares that a seat in the Honourable the Senate having become vacant, the seat was offered in the name of the Government to Mr. H. H. Cook, ex M. P., on the payment by him of the sum of \$10,000.

"That the said Mr. H. H. Cook declined to pay for the advice to be given to Your Excellency on the subject of an appointment to the Honourable the Senate.

"That in the opinion of Your Excellency's petitioners, offices and honours ought not to be for sale, and Ministers of the Crown are not justified in deriving revenue by disposing of them for money.

"That the sale of offices and honours is a breach of trust and is a dishonour to the Crown.

"That the representatives of the people cannot enquire into this form of corruption, and that although the criminal law can reach it in the case of an individual offender, it cannot reach it where a Government is guilty.

"Therefore, Your Excellency's petitioners pray that Your Excellency take such measures as may be deemed advisable to discover all the facts, to punish the guilty, to put an end to the practice, and to restore the good

name of Canada, which has been sullied by this deplorable revelation. "And Your Excellency's petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray."

The hospital commission of the Imperial Parliament, now hearing evidence on the alleged break-down of the field hospital system of the army in South Africa, will probably have something nice to say of Canadian ingenuity. Sir Thomas Taylor has received from his son, Lieut. Taylor, of the second Canadian Mounted Rifles, a copy of the Bloemfontein Post of September 4th, containing the evidence taken before the Hospital Commission on the previous day. One of the witnesses was a clergyman named Rev. Stuart Franklin. In the course of his evidence, Rev. Mr. Franklin said:—"With regard to the mattresses I think something might have been done. On one occasion I saw a dozen men who were filling some mattress covers with straw, but they told me these were only for their own men in the hospital. In the hospital you could have spotted the men belonging to that corps, as they had all mattresses. They were the Canadian corps, and if it was possible for one corps to do this it should have been possible for others."
