**SIEGE OF SANTIAGO
PLAN OF ATTACK.**

The Leaders Reticent

SMALL BODIES OF SOLDIERS.
WILL BE PUT ASHORE AT DIF-
FERENT POINTS.

OFF SANTIAGO, June 22.—The officers
had several hours consultation yesterday
with the Cuban General. At the conclusion
of the conference, General Shafter and
other officers had little or nothing to say
regarding the plans for a landing.

The American troops are for the co-
operation with the Cubans.
The best information obtainable is that
there will be no attempt to make general
landings for two or three days, but that
small bodies of troops will be put ashore,
likely at several points both east and west
of Santiago to-day.

—The British Yukon Company, which
the Duke of Teck and other London capi-
talists floated last year, have combined
with an organization of Americans under
the financial direction of Close Brothers,
of Chicago, to put into operation the railway
powers granted by the Dominion Parli-
ament at the session of 1897, and a
building a railway into the Yukon coun-
try. The charter then granted empow-
ers the company to construct a railway of
4.8½ gauge from the head of the Lynn
canal across the White Pass, and thence
northerly and westerly by the most
feasible route to Selkirk. Advances
from Skaguay, which will be the
southern terminus of the line, say that
three hundred men are at work, and large
quantities of rails, ties, as well as loco-
motives and cars, to be used in construction,
are on their way. The company receives
no subsidy or land grant from the Govern-
ment, but is going into the undertaking
for what can be made out of it, on business
lines.

**DISASTERS IN
THE OLD WORLD
AND IN THE NEW.**

Aged Couple Burned to
Death at Halifax.

Hundreds Submerged at
a Launch.

MANY SAVED—TWENTY BODIES
RECOVERED.

Others Swept Away by Flood—
Sixty Spectators Injured.

HALIFAX, June 22.—A fire occurred
this morning on Granville street, in which
an aged couple, named Hurley, were burned
to death.

LONDON, June 22.—During the launch-
ing of the British battle-ship Albion, at
Blackwell, by the Duchess of York, the
displacement of the water caused an im-
mense mass of water to rise on all sides,
completely submerging one of the stages
of the yard, and immersing hundreds of
people. Up to the last report, thirty
bodies had been recovered. The victims
were mostly working people on a holiday,
who had trespassed on the ship-building
yards where the launching took place.
They crowded upon the stage, from
which they had been warned off,
but the force of police on the
spot was inadequate to control the im-
mense number. About 200 persons were
thrown into the water. Most of those
rescued were by numerous row-boats in
the vicinity, but many were swept away
by the flood tide which was running and
sank before assistance could reach them.
About 60 spectators were injured and had
to receive surgical treatment.

GENERAL SHAFTER.**

4000 Additional Men

TO BE SENT UNDER COMMAND

of Brigadier General Duffield.

WASHINGTON, June 22.—The Govern-
ment has determined to send a heavy rein-
forcement to General Shafter at Santiago.
The first expedition will leave Newport
News on Thursday morning, carrying
Brigadier General Duffield's separate Ir-
gade of second army corps made up of
the 91st Massachusetts and the 32nd and
34th Michigan and 3rd Virginia regiments,
in all about 4000 men.
Other expeditions will follow rapidly.
