## Maine Potato Council Sends Envoy To Spain

The following news item from the Bangor (Maine) Daily News of March 10 will be of interest to all concerned in the Potato Industry.

**PRESQUE ISLE**, - Gordon Robertson of Caribou is winging his way to Spain as an emissary in a move to develop spud exports to that nation.

The Potato Industry Council of Maine announced this morning the selection of Robertson following a meeting of Aroostook County potato officials in Caribou Thursday night.

Frank W. Hussey, executive vice president of the council, said that Robertson's primary duties while in Spain will be to survey the situation there and to proceed with negotiations. He felt Presque Isle on this morning's flight for Boston and will take an overseas plane out of the Hub Saturday.

Officials of the council said that Robertson is well qualified to handle the export situation inasmuch as he handled the transaction for export of some 26,000 cars to Spain during the time potatoes were under price support in 1950.

In addition to making the appointment of Robertson to the Spanish post, the group laid extensive plans in setting up exporting and assembly facilities to be located at the council offices in Presque Isle and announced a series of meetings starting next week.
