WINNIPEG, July 10 (CP)—New seasonal lows were registered by wheat futures prices for the rising grain exchange today as liberal outside selling, prompted by promising reports from the western Canada spring grain belt, ran the market into stop-loss liquidation.

Final quotations were 1-1 1-8 cent lower, with July at 84 3-8, Oct. 84 7-8-55, Nov. 85 3-4-5 and Dec. 85 7-8 cents.

Cash wheat transactions were confined to small purchases of Nos. 1, 2 and 3 Northern by exporters and shippers. Apart from minor buying in oats and barley by export interests, coarse grain pit-trading was uninteresting as prices in most commodities declined in sympathy with wheat.

THE Dominion of Canada was the first country in the world to adopt a complete system of national inspection and control of electricity and gas meters used for establishing a charge.

The division of government that pioneered this service is the Electricity and Gas Inspection Branch of the Department of Trade and Commerce. The act authorizing inspection and control came into effect for gas, in 1875; and for electricity, in 1894.

**APPROVED—INSPECTED—SEALED!**

The Electricity and Gas Inspection Acts provide that, before being installed for the purpose of establishing a charge, each type of meter must be first approved. Then every meter must be tested for accuracy and upon passing tests shall be sealed by the government so that it cannot be opened or tampered with. After six years in service every meter must be re-inspected and re-sealed.

**METER INSPECTION FROM COAST TO COAST**

There are 20 offices maintained throughout Canada by the Government for the Electricity and Gas Inspection Service. These offices are supported by a main laboratory at Ottawa and two divisional laboratories in Winnipeg and Vancouver, also by a complete engineering service at Toronto for the design, construction and erection of equipment. Approximately 100 inspectors are necessary to adequately service every part of Canada where meters are used. Every meter in use must have the government seal. This red wax seal is the guarantee of the Department of Trade and Commerce that

**Produce Prices**

MONTREAL, July 10 (CP)—Cheese, potatoes and butter ruled steady to a shade higher on open produce markets here today while egg prices slipped fractionally, the Dominion Department of Agriculture reported.

Creamery butter prints to retailers sold for 23-23 1-2 cents a pound and solids for 22 1-2-23 Western butter delivered in Montreal was unquoted. Quebec No. 1 graded egg shipments to Montreal made 22 1-8.

Ontario white cheese was quoted at 12 3-4 a pound and colored at 12 1-8 and colored at 12 3-8.

Free cases were offered at 24-24 1-2 cents a dozen for A-large, 22-22 1-2 for A-medium, 17 for B-large, 14-14 1-2 for C.

The market showed a recovery trend in the final hour. The buying was a little faster than in the earlier hours and bids were advanced for some of the goods. Conlaurem spurred to 2 25 for a net gain of 14 cents and Anur moved up from 2 73 to 2 78 for a gain of 5 cents.

The senior gold share market was dull. Dome closed unchanged. McIntyre dropped 1-2 and Lake Shore closed 1-2 higher.

The base metal group boarded four gains against 2 losses. Smelters and Noranda weakened 1-2 and Nickel firmed 1-4. Waitemeta, the strongest of the group, moved up 20 cents and Sheritt was active at an advance of 5 cents.

Home and Calgary-Edmonton were the most active of the western oil group and at the close Home was up 2 and Calgary-Edmonton down 2. Royaltite weakened a fraction for a broken lot and Davies eased off 1-2.

### Livestock

MONTREAL, July 10 (CP)—Receipts in the Montreal livestock market today were cattle 727, calves 1763, Sheep 58, hogs 1344.

Early trading was devoted to small stock and there were not enough early sales of cattle to establish prices. Prices for small stock, that is for calves, lambs and hogs, were from barely steady to 25 cents lower.

Grass calves ranged from \$3.50 to \$4.50 with the bulk between \$3.50 and \$4. Strong calves sold up to \$5.25. Good drinkers and medium good veals sold up to \$5.75 and medium quality veals up to \$6.50. One calf sold for \$7.50.

Lambs sold from \$9 to \$9.50 with \$1 per cwt. out on bucks and \$2 per cwt. cut on culls. Common to medium sheep made from \$2 to \$3.50 and good sheep from \$3.50 to \$4.

Hogs were \$9.75 for bacon fed and watered with a premium of \$1 per hog on select and the usual cuts on off grades. Sows were slow selling for \$5 to \$5.50 to packers with odd sales up to \$6.50 to local butchers. Rail grade hogs made from \$13.25 to \$13.35 cold weight.

Montreal—Utilities, papers and golds higher; other industrials lower.

New York—Stocks closed slightly higher.

Winnipeg—Wheat 1-1 1-8 cents lower.

New York—Cotton higher; rubber and coffee lower; sugar unchanged.

### Currencies

NEW YORK, July 10 (AP)—The British pound rose 1-8 cent to 4 68 1-4 in terms of the United States dollar today, leading most other European currencies forward.

The gain in Sterling placed the British money 1-4 cent above the price (\$4.68) at which control authorities have recently supported the currency.

The Canadian dollar advanced 1-64 cent to 15-84 per cent discount, slightly higher were the belga, the sulder and the Swiss franc while the French franc was unchanged at 2.65.

MONTREAL, July 10 (CP)—Found Sterling moved back 1-8 to 4 69 7-32 wh. the United States dollar gave up 1-32 at 1 00 7-32 on Montreal foreign exchange today. French francs also declined slightly to 2.65 1-2.
