Water Safety School Has Swim Meet Clinic

Don Hickey, Saint John, conducted a two-day swim meet at P.F.I. headquarters last weekend. Mr. Hickey, who is past president of the N.B. branch of the Canadian Amateur Swimming Association, outlined rules, duties of officials, accepted strokes, and necessary equipment to conduct a swim meet. This clinic was held in conjunction with the Red Cross swimming and water safety school for lifeguards and supervisors.

David Boswell, director of physical education and alcohol studies for P.F.I. introduced Mr. Hickey and outlined the importance of public relations to P.F.I. members.

The YMCA pool ideally provided conditions for the practical phase of the program, while theory was outlined in the lecture room. Candidates at the clinic officiated at a mock swim meet while the YMCA team provided the competitive element. This meet featured various strokes and events, and was run off in accordance with C.A.S.A. rules.

Mrs. H. Oudmore, director of Red Cross swimming and water safety, thanked Mr. Hickey and emphasized the importance of swimming competitions in the province.

FAMILY OF 13 ESCAPES

A blaze fanned by gale force winds Saturday levelled the Sherwood home of Peter Creamer forcing the family of 13 to flee, some suffering from burns and threatened to spread to neighboring residences.

The fire was first noticed shortly before 7 p.m. by the oldest daughter Joan when she went to the back door to check the young children and discovered fire in the basement.

Only occupants of the house were the mother, Mrs. Kathleen, and the two oldest daughters, Joan, 16, and Kathleen, 14. The other nine children were out playing and Mr. Creamer was working across the road.

Fames Fanned by Gale Engulf Sherwood Home

The cellar stairway igniting her clothing, Mrs. Creamer quickly smothered the flames with a blanket but Joan had to be taken to hospital suffering from serious burns to her upper body and face.

Kathleen who was standing nearby at the time, received minor burns on arm and hip.

Fire departments from both Sherwood and Parkdale were at the scene within minutes, the alarm having been turned in by a neighbor, Mrs. Scott Coffin, but their efforts were hampered by the strong winds and the rapid spread of the blaze.

When it became obvious that the Creamer home was beyond saving, firemen's efforts were aimed at saving the Coffin home which was threatened by flying sparks and tremendous heat. Several lines of hose tra-

Ward has named his sisters among others, Princes Phillip, Princess Margaret, Lord Snowdon, Princess Marina and Princess Alexandra.

As Ward was arrested, Conservative legislators spoke out frankly about the embarrassment the Profumo scandal holds for Macmillan and the government.

John Cordle, Tory member, told constituents:

"We cannot afford to have had security risks in high office in this country.

"Men who choose to live in adultery, men who are homosexual or men whose moral influence is against the highest interests of our nation ought not to be appointed to serve our Queen and country."

HOLD EDGE IN HOUSE

The Conservatives hold an edge of about 100 seats in the House of Commons under normal circumstances could easily turn back any opposition against the Macmillan government over the affair.

However, some Conservative legislators expressed doubts about whether they can continue to support Macmillan as party leader. The Sunday Telegraph, which usually speaks for the party, said that the Profumo affair Parliament's "worst scandal in living memory."

Macmillan must call new elections before October 1964. The Sunday Telegraph predicted an election before then, but it will dim the Conservatives' already dim chances of winning re-election.

Profumo and his wife, movie star Yvonne Hillman, drove away from their London home Wednesday morning and it was not known when they will return.

LONDON (AP)—Chief characters in the life and times of Christine Keeler:

Christine Keeler, 34, West Indian — once she lived with Christine. Then she discarded him.

Johnnie Dean, 32, was arrested after shooting a pistol outside an apartment she was visiting. Now he is serving a seven-year jail sentence.

Christine Keeler, 31, red-headed showgirl waitress, show girl and model who today is at the centre of Britain's most sensational political scandal. She says she aspires to be a film star and is helping to plan the Christine Keeler Story.

Mandy Rice-Davies, blonde, 18-year-old fashion model. Christine's friend—she recently returned from Spain to help Scotland Yard in their galions of an alleged call-girl ring in London. "A number of well-known people will be involved," she told reporters.

Paula Hamilton-Marshall, 30, former Miss Canada, who was called with Christine and Mandy and their friends—she testified for Christine at the Bailey assault trial last week.

Robin Drury, 29, speaks with a Canadian accent and describes himself as Christine's business manager—after Profumo's confession, Drury asked reporters how much they were prepared to pay for Christine's story.

George Wieg, Labor Party Member of Parliament, was the man who brought Profumo's association with Keeler to public notice. He did so by asking a question on the subject in the House of Commons. At the time he was criticized for doing so.
