

Judge Rules Booing Queen Not Illegal

QUEBEC (CP)—A municipal judge ruled that booing the Queen is not illegal and dismissed charges against two Montreal-district students.

The two students, both 18, were arrested and police said they yelled "cha-cha" the French equivalent of boo—as the Queen as she drove up to the Quebec Legislature Building Oct. 10.

"That the accused sang, called out slogans and even addressed disrespectful cries to the Queen perhaps shows a lack of education and courtesy but it certainly cannot, in the present context, constitute an illegal act," ruled Judge Marcel LeTourneau of Quebec Municipal Court.

He ordered that charges of disorderly conduct be dismissed against Ronald Grenier and Pierrefonds and Jean-Paul Urban of Ste. Rose.

The judge said two provincial policemen who arrested the youths were justified in making the arrests as "a preventive measure aimed at avoiding illegal and deplorable acts."

Only witnesses in the case were the two provincial policemen who made the arrests, across grande allee from the legislature building. They said the two students were among 20 or 25 persons who had shouted separatist slogans such as "Quebec for Quebecers" before the royal party arrived.

BRITISH SEEK GHOST BOMBER

MAIDENHEAD, England (AP)—British police searched for a phantom bomber who blows up telephone booths.

A police official in Maidenhead said "he probably has a grudge against the telephone people. Perhaps he got tragic news by phone or too many wrong numbers."

In his first strike, the bomber planted a package of homemade explosives in a telephone booth in the village of Woodburn Green, about 20 miles from London. The blast blew off the roof and the door.

Then he blew up a booth at Knowle Hill, a village 20 miles away.

"It is difficult to believe this is the work of a sane man," the police official said. "The real danger is someone might get killed or maimed."

Pope Paul's Indian Flight Set For Dec. 2

ROME (AP)—Vatican sources said here Pope Paul will fly to Bombay Dec. 2 on the long-range papal trip ever and return about Dec. 4.

The pontiff announced Oct. 18 that he would go to Bombay for the International Eucharistic Congress, a two-week gathering opening Nov. 28 but did not specify the dates of his trip.

Vatican sources said he would fly to Bombay non-stop on a jet passenger airliner in time to be in Bombay for Dec. 3, feast day of St. Francis Xavier, who is buried in Goa, south of Bombay. The 4,100-mile jet flight to Bombay from Rome takes about eight hours. It is believed the Pope will arrive in Bombay the evening of Dec. 2.

The time of his departure is still not definite. Vatican sources said he is expected to remain in Bombay for the last two days of the congress, but might visit New Delhi briefly. Sources said he would fly on a Vatican-chartered jet airliner, possibly an Air India plane.

Mrs. Rideout Expects Soon Election Soon

MONCTON (CP)—Minutes after Mrs. Margaret Rideout was elected New Brunswick's first woman Member of Parliament, a Liberal party worker in Westmorland constituency commented that Mrs. Rideout had "I've got to hang together. There may be another in six months," replied the 41-year-old Moncton widow.

Widow of the late Sherwood H. Rideout who has the vote for the Liberals until his death in May, Mrs. Rideout piled up a surplus of 61 more than 6,000 votes in defeating a Progressive Conservative and a New Democrat.

Mrs. Rideout said she would leave for Ottawa immediately following the declaration of her victory.

"The business of this constituency has been left too long. I will accept nothing but the best for the county." Mrs. Rideout declined to go deeply into a discussion of the current flag issue, but said the Commons flag committee had returned a recommendation by a 10-4 margin and the majority should decide.
