Of Special Interest to our Farmers

Does it Pay to Keep Cows Quiet?

Should cows be kept quiet? Yes. Why? Because it pays. How do you know it pays?

In answer to this question, let me relate the experience of one of our best dairymen. He says:

"I had heard a good deal about the bad effect of excitement upon the cow, and I made up my mind that I would know whether there was anything in it or whether it was like a good many other fine spun theories; so one night I deliberately planned an attack upon my cows. I told the hired man to get him a cudgel, and I got one myself. We took the dog and went out into the cow yard just before milking. We halloed and yelled and flourished our sticks, but didn't strike a blow. The dog barked loudly and for a time pandemonium prevailed. Then we let the cows into the barn and milked them.

I was dumfounded at the result. The falling off in the amount of milk was not so very much, though there was a marked difference; the most striking loss was in the quality of the milk. I have a reliable test myself, and I cannot be mistaken when I say that at least two fifths of the butter fat had disappeared—been burned up by the excitement of a few minutes' abuse just before milking.

I told the hired man then that hereafter if he felt he must strike somebody to strike me, and that if he spoke at all in the stable I wanted it to be in a tone of voice such as he would use in speaking to me."

Now, this is not theory; it is not fancy; it is plain matter-of-fact business. Every time a man kicks, pounds, shouts or otherwise has a "tantrum" with his cows, he takes money out of his own pocket. He had better stand it if the cow thumps him now and then with her tail, or stands around a step or two while being milked than to make a bigger fool of himself than the cow by getting into a rage and turning the stable into a bedlam.—Practical Dairying.

If your pigs are not on pasture, as they should be, see that they have plenty of green feed. Clover or peas and oats should be cut and carried to them. Give your brood sows a few sods daily, also.

If you have much hay to cut, do not wait for it to get old enough before you begin cutting. If you do you will be harvesting woody fibre in August and leaving the value of the hay in the seed shelled on the ground.

Keep the cultivator going as long as you can get through without destroying the crowd. Keep down the weeds and conserve the moisture by shallow cultivation. Never run the cultivator deep when the crops are well grown.

Don't be afraid to give the cows plentiful supplies of the peas and oats you have sowed for them. If you cannot keep your cows up to full flow of milk now you will come very short later on, when they naturally begin to shrink.

Make the ceilings over your stables as nearly airtight as possible before you pile on the fodder. The odor from the stable will otherwise be absorbed in large quantities by the hay and not only make it distasteful to the cattle but unhealthy as well.

We are glad to learn that lambs are now being bought by weight on P. E. Island and that it is already having a good effect on the quality of the lambs.

Not only does a well grown lamb weigh more pounds, but he is also worth more per pound. About 3c. per pound, live weight, is now being paid for good lambs.

If you noticed that a few of your hens did better as layers last season than others, place them by themselves and purchase a full blooded cock to place with them. You will find that all the pullets from this flock will be much better than those not so bred. This is the way to breed up a flock of useful birds.

Increased attention must now be given to the aeration and cooling of the milk intended for the cheese factory and creamery. Dog days will soon be here and with them must come especial care in the dairy department. Keep every thing scrupulously clean and don't be afraid to spend a few minutes in airing and cooling the milk.
