I have thought fit, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Executive Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued until Tuesday the Sixth day of November next, of which all persons concerned are required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

ROAD COMPENSATION ACT.

WHEREAS a writ has been issued, directed to us under and by virtue of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to regulate the laying out and altering of Highways;" and of the Acts in amendment thereof, whereby we are commanded to enquire what damage or advantage will accrue to those persons who are interested in the land through which a certain new road is intended to be made, commencing at the Cross Road at Pierre Jacques School House, and to go northwardly, terminating at the O'Leary Road, and which road will run through or over Lands belonging to A. & A.
