

# 1950 Maritime Harness Racing Review 1950

## Thrilling Season Recalled Featuring Photo Finishes, Large Purses, More Performers

Spectacular racing with more heats—more performers—more 2.10 miles—more photo finishes and more money raced for featured the Maritimes most successful racing season in years. 25 tracks gave purses totalling over \$200,000 with Truro Raceway putting up \$48,310, Charlottetown Exhibition Association \$46,048 and Sydney \$43,943. These three tracks operated mostly with night racing but Charlottetown as usual, held its Old Home Week and Goodwill Races afternoons and nights. Truro also gave afternoon racing at its Exhibition and fall meeting in addition to its big program of night racing. Sydney opened its new night racing plant June 13th and continued until October 9th. Under the management of Ken MacDougall it changed the racing picture in Cape Breton from a gloomy to a brilliant hue as will be seen when you glance over the following pages. Truro, Charlottetown and Sydney put up the bulk of the money raced for the past season. Three new tracks were opened—St. Anthony, N.B., Kinkora and Springfield, P.E.I.

Lorne Letcher of Springhill, N.S., leads all Maritime drivers in percentage under the Universal Drivers Rating System. Worrell Lewis, Reserve, C.B., is top heat winner with 77, and he also made the most starts.

The fastest miles paced over Maritime tracks were by Private George 2.02, owned by Simonson Bros., Bridgewater, Me., and driven by Harry Simonson, at Fredericton, July 20—2.07, and by Fabian Hanover 2.07, owned by C.C. Seeley, Fort Fairfield, Me., and driven by J.K. Thomas, at Woodstock, July 28—2.07. The three fastest heats stepped were by Lock Hanover 2.08, owned by Bert Yerxa, Sussex, N.B., and driven by Claude O'Brien, at Moncton, August 3rd—2.07, 2.09, 2.09. Quaker's Boy, owned by George Kuhn, Dartmouth, and driven by Johnny Conroy, trotted the fastest heat—2.11—at Truro, July 12th. Jennie Kalmuck 2.11, owned by Lorne Letcher, Springhill, and driven by Henry O'Donnell, won the greatest number of heats trotted or paced—26, and she also set up a new trotting record for two miles at Truro, Oct. 9—4:44. At the same meeting, Victory Dale 2.05, owned by B.C. Cruikshank, Halifax, and driven by Buddy Cruikshank, set up a new 1½ miles pacing record of 3.20.

More horses were raced and more new or reduced records made than in any recent year. The number of persons who witnessed racing in the Maritimes the past season is estimated at between 350,000 and 400,000. New and very speedy horses were purchased by Maritimers at Harrisburg and elsewhere and these will help to keep racing enthusiasm keyed up for 1951.

The racing season started at North Sydney, Blue Acres, Springhill and Lower Sackville, N.S. on May 24th and ended Oct. 8th with races at Sydney and Truro, N.S., Riversdale, P.E.I. and Sussex, N.B. There were 1275 heats or dashes raced which is a record, made possible by the addition of Sydney to the formerly operating Charlottetown and Truro night racing plants. The night racing plants also gave more opportunity for new performers to measure strides with older ones and as a result quite a number of promising trotters and pacers showed up that will be keen competitors in many classes the coming year.

The P.E.I. Harness Racing Club received great encouragement because of the number of two-three and four-year-old trotters and pacers that were on hand to race at their fall meeting, Sept. 8th. The outlook for futurites in the future seems bright indeed as upwards of 400 foals are expected in this Province alone the coming year.

At St. Peters Raceway, P.E.I., a new track pacing record was set up by Filbert 2.09, owned by Walter Hennessey, Charlottetown, and driven by Joe Hennessey—2.12. Under the heading Maritime Track Records, you will find the fastest miles stepped at the newly opened

Truro and Moncton are tied for first place honors in number of 2.10 miles stepped over their tracks with 12 each, followed by Charlottetown with 10, Sydney 8, St. Stephen 7, Fredericton and Woodstock four each, North Sydney two and Sussex, N.B. one.

Top 2.10 driver of the year is Clayton MacLeod of Westville, N.S., with eight, his mare Iola Henley 2.09 having that number to her credit. In second place Harley Harrison and Claude O'Brien are tied with six, followed by another tie between Harry Simonson and Paul Woodcock with five, Angie Allen and Joe MacDonald four each, and with two to their credit are W. Halfpenny, Billy Hood, Lorne Letcher, Worrell Lewis, H.M. Sweeney, Dr. J.K. Thomas, and with one each we have Roy Barnett, Frankie Carr, J.H. DeWitt, S. Horseman, Col. D.A. Maritime Race Winners

There were 1275 heats or dashes raced in 1950, an all time high for the Maritimes, Nova Scotia in the Island with over 600, Prince Edward Island second with approximately 400 and New Brunswick with 255. Nova Scotia also had the greatest number of individual meetings—71 in number. Top heat winner of the year is the trotter Jennie Kalmuck 2.11 by Kalmuck, owned by Lorne Letcher, Springhill, N.S. and driven by Henry O'Donnell with 28. Her stablemate, the pacing mare Miss Donna Mae 2.12, by Calumet Budlong, owned and driven by Lorne Letcher, is second with 22 and in third place is the three-year-old trotting stallion Cobblestone by Follow Up, owned by P.J. Cadevan of Glace Bay, N.S., and driven by Worrell Lewis, with 21. Next on the list is Scott Spencer 2.06, bay gelding by Spentice, owned by Harry Hirsch, Sydney and driven by Harley Harrison, with 19, and Iola Henley 2.09, by Peter Henley, leading 2.10 miler this season, is in fifth place with 18 heats won, eight of them in 2.10 or better.
