Baptist Church Engages Organist - Choir Director

Victor McCorry of Halifax, N.S. who has been engaged as Organist and Choir Director of the Charlottetown United Baptist Church, arrived in Charlottetown on Thursday and will take over his duties at the services on Sunday.

Mr. McCorry who is a brilliant young musician, filled the position of Organist and Choir Director of St. Mathias Church in Halifax at the early age of 16, a position he held for four years. Through Music Festivals and other public performances he soon came to the attention of Halifax musical circles and as a result has been studying in London, England, under a scholarship of The Nova Scotia Talent Trust, an organization founded for the purpose of encouraging the development of outstanding musical talent. It will be recalled that several musicians of note have been sponsored by this organization, among them the well known Portia White and Audrey Farnell.

During his years of study in London, Mr. McCorry has been supply organist and choir director in a number of churches in and near London, and has also been heard in numerous recitals which brought many flattering comments from his listeners. Prior to his recent return to Canada he was organist and choir director of Trinity Presbyterian Church at Hampstead.
