Claims Gov't Departments Are Too Anxious To Spend

OTTAWA (CP)—Federal government departments are too inclined to see how much money they can get from Parliament, Auditor-General Watson Sellar said Wednesday. The outspoken guardian of the taxpayer's money suggested to the Commons public accounts committee that Parliament's money votes for departments should be made with closer regard to what a department will turn in revenue from the public. He proposed that "in suitable circumstances, votes include estimated future revenues for services performed."

Prospectors Offered Good Risk In Northeast Alberta

By JIM PEACOCK Canadian Press Staff Writer EDMONTON (CP) — The Research Council of Alberta indicates the northeast corner of the province offers prospectors a risk worth taking. In time and with sufficient development work, it may prove to be a rich commercial mining area, producing among other things high-grade uranium. Its commercial value, however, remains to be established by private developers. The council carries out preliminary investigation only. The research council, a provincial government establishment, has carried out a two-year study of surface showings and in a report released Wednesday says it found "interesting" new deposits of molybdenite and radioactive minerals. "There is still a great deal of work to be done by prospectors and others before we'll know the full significance of the surface showings. They are encouraging however."
