Bob Lemon Sparks Indians To 6-3 Win Over Chicago

 Bob Lemon, Cleveland right-hander, turned in a sparkling three-hitter to beat Chicago White Sox 6-3 Wednesday and send the Indians off winging in the American League race. The victory gave the Indians a sweep of their two-game series with the Chicagoans and temporary lead of the league. The pitchers took control of an abbreviated major league program following Tuesday's opening day deluge of home runs. Duane Pillette fashioned a strong six-hit effort as Baltimore Orioles gained a 3-2 triumph over Detroit Tigers. The old reliable, Eddie Lopat, got New York Yankees on the winning road again with a 2-1 verdict over Washington Senators. It was the 12th straight for Lopat over his Washington "cousins" but he needed a pair of costly errors by Wayne Terwilliger to turn the trick. These were the only games scheduled in the American League, Philadelphia Athletics and Boston

Red Sox were idle. In the only daytime activity in the National League, lefty Curt Simmons pitched a shutout and got some good bat support from Willie Jones to throttle Pittsburgh Pirates 6-0. Simmons gave up only four safeties. Jones, the Phillies' third baseman, moved up from seventh to the leadoff spot and contributed a two-run homer, a double and two singles in five appearances. New York Giants, who beat Brooklyn Dodgers on Willie Mays' homer Tuesday, entertained the National League champions in the season's first night game at the Polo Grounds. The effectiveness of the 33-year-old Lemon's pitching performance is not shown in the final score. After giving up two runs in the first on a walk, a triple by Minnie Mino and a roller to short, he faced no more than three men an inning from the second through the seventh. The third run came on a two-base error by Bill Clynm in the eighth. Jack Harshman, who left in the fourth inning, was the loser. At Washington, the game was tied 1-1 when the Yankees came to bat in the ninth. Then with one out, Phil Rizzuto walked and Lopat topped a ball which Eddie Yost fielded at third and threw to Terwilliger for what looked like a sure double play. But Terwilliger dropped the ball. A moment later Terwilliger let a soft pop by Hank Bauer slip through his fingers and Rizzuto scored from third with the winning run. The Orioles shelled Ray Herbert for their winning runs in the first inning at Detroit. Rookie Bill Tuttle of the Tigers homered off Pillette in the ninth.

It has been an unusual series in that the Red Wings have won two games on Montreal ice while the Canadiens have won two of their games at the spacious Detroit Olympia. Over the season both teams were practically unbeatable at home. The Canadiens in particular have always been noted for their play before the home-town fans. There is a saying in hockey that the best team in the world is the Canadiens on Montreal ice.

Following the Canadiens' 3-1 loss at Montreal in the third game of the series the Montreal fans were howling for Dick Irvin's scalp. Dour Dick, however, soon made things right when he took the game on Gerry MacNeill and brought up Gaye Stewart from Buffalo. If the Canadiens go on to win the cup Irvin's decision to replace Jacques Plante with MacNeill may go down in history as one of the smartest moves in Stanley Cup play. MacNeill hadn't stopped an enemy puck since Feb. 11 but in the two games he has played in the finals he has allowed only one goal.

Ex-Islander goalie of a year ago All Millar is performing brilliantly for the Sudbury Wolves in the Eastern Canada Senior Hockey play-offs. Millar was a standout for Sudbury in the Ontario play-offs especially against the Owen Sound Mercurys in the finals. According to the Sudbury press he was the difference between the Wolves winning and losing the championship. For most of the season Millar shared goal-tending duties with a fellow named Anderson but his play in the play-offs has given him sole possession of the janitor's duties.

One of the surprises of the hockey season is the strong showing of the Matane Red Rocks against Sudbury. Matane played in the Lower St. Lawrence River League against Rimouski, Mont Joli and Three Rivers. Hockey fans here received an idea of the calibre of play in the League when Gerry LaChance and Joe LeBlanc played with the Islanders for a little more than a week last fall. LaChance finished the season with Rimouski while LeBlanc was suspended from hockey for five
