BRITISH MEDICAL ASSOCIATION
 Drainage of Charlottetown Discussed by Dr. McLeod.

MONREAL, Sept. 3.—At the meeting of the British Medical Association yesterday, Dr. James McLeod, of Charlottetown, described the system of drainage in that city, saying that he was ashamed to acknowledge that his city was in such a condition that the air was polluted, the cellars damp and fungi growing therein.

SITUATION IN INDIA.
 Favorable to British Troops

SIMLA, Sept. 3.—The rumor that the Indian Government is about to send a letter to the Ameer regarding the alleged complicity of the Afghans in the frontier war is without foundation. The Ameer's first reply to the government is regarded as satisfactory. News has been received that a flying column under Colonel Richardson has reached Sadda, thus rendering Parichinad, the head quarters in the Kurau Valley, safe, as Sadda commands the only route from the Orakzai country.
 News from the Kohat side is satisfactory also, the Orakzais having withdrawn from British territory though large forces of them are still forcing Samana.

TURKS AND GREEKS.
 A Tiff on the Island of Crete.

ATHENS, Sept. 30.—Insurgents at Crete fired upon the Turkish troops there on Wednesday last. The latter returned the fire, but there were no casualties.
