Wright, the father of the above named infants, lately died seized and possessed.

The Farm and Premises above mentioned are situated on the Main Road, between Somerset (formerly South-west settlement) and Freetown, Bedeque; having a frontage of 125 chains on the said Road, and being 10 chains in breadth, a little more or less.

One lot comprising the Mills, with a Cottage 20 by 18 feet, and a Workshop 18 by 15 feet, for the use of a Miller, with 25 acres of Land attached. The second Lot will comprise the Farm proper, consisting of about 75 acres, with the Dwelling House and other Buildings above described; and the remaining 25 acres, being the northern section of the tract, and all cleared, will form the third Lot.
