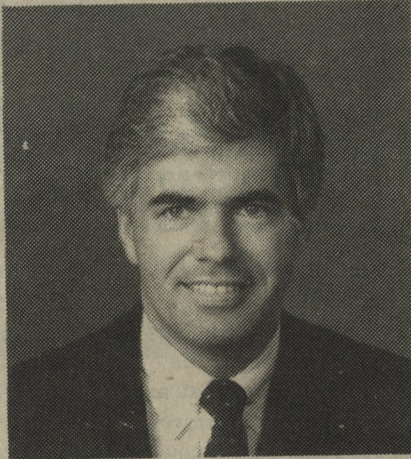

#### Part two

the UPEI Student Union wished to present to you part two of a four part series regarding post-secondary education issues as provided by the Canadian Federation of Students.

**Question** - Would you advocate the renegotiation of EPF to provide for accountability on the part of the provinces to spend post-secondary education monies in this sector?

**Progressive Conservative Party** - The party's pledge, before the last election and since forming the Government, has been to seek a new era of federal-provincial reconciliation in all areas; the economy, the Constitution, and not least of all, in post-secondary issues, co-operation we feel is a crucial element in achieving solutions to the very real difficulties facing higher education and in general university funding in particular.

**Liberal Party** - Yes. The Federal Liberal Caucus Task Force on Post-Secondary Education recognized the need for a system of incentives and accountability. It recommended that adequate funding be provided to post-secondary education in co-operation and negotiations with the provinces, in particular by; a) insuring federal funds identified for post-secondary education are in fact spent on post-secondary education, and b) providing incentives for the provinces to increase their contributions to post-secondary education, taking into account equalization to protect poorer provinces.

**New Democratic Party** - We tried to do just this in 1984. at that time we moved an amendment to government legislation which would have demanded accountability from the provinces. Both the Liberals and
