## JESSE JAMES' CAVE.

Secret Home of the Celebrated Robber Discovered.

St. PAUL, Dec. 22. - Great excitement prevails in Lescuyer and Nicolet counties over the discovery in Lake Prairie township, Nicolet county, of the subterranean rendezvous of the Younger and James boys and their band of outlaws before and after their raid upon the Northfield Bank in 1876, in which six men were killed. One of the Missouri bandits evidently died in this wonderful constructed home in the earth, as his bones were found there.

A party of young farmers started out yesterday on a rabbit shooting expedition and while traversing what is known as the Barney Fay ravine one of the party stumbled and fell, pulling down an embankment to the bed of a creek. In attempting to scramble up the bank he discovered an old weatherbeaten door, which was held to its place by a couple of pieces of leather. This door stood partly ajar. It opened into an apartment dark as midnight and as mysterious as was day.

A careful examination, however, revealed the fact that these logs formed a "blind" door which led into a room twenty feet long and perhaps sixteen feet wide, along one side of which banks were arranged, something after the fashion of berths on a steamboat. Judging from the number of these, at least thirty persons had found sleeping accommodations in this secluded and mysterious place of abode. This room contained several benches and stools, an old table, tin plates and cups, kettles, a No. 9 cook stove and various cooking utensils. In one corner stood an old box on end, which had evidently served as a cupboard near which was found a rough board which had been used as a flour chest. This box was partitioned off and one end contained 30 or 40 pounds of buckwheat flour.

The young man shouted to his companions who promptly responded, and after carefully surveying the exterior of the mysterious premises a lantern was sent for and a thorough exploration of the interior was commenced. The first apartment entered was a common dugout, only about eight feet square, and had seemingly been used as a sort of anteroom. On the back end or side a space of about six feet was covered from the ceiling to the ground floor with hewed logs, stood on end and close together. In the logs were numerous nails, driven apparently for the purpose of hanging clothes.

Some old faded decks of playing cards and an old newspaper, and a badly splattered copy of "The Cannon" were found scattered about on the rude slab floor. In the book was found a poorly written letter from Frank Jones to James Younger in reference to the stealing of some horses.

Connecting with the strange abode is an artificial cave with 18 hiding posts, where the horses of the outlaws were kept.

A skull and other bones belonging to a human being were found under a pile of partly decayed corn stalks. The probably the body which Coleman Younger carried away from Northfield after a terrific fight at the bank and which has never been accounted for. The place is as impenetrable as Gibraltar, and so well supplied with food and ammunition could hold it against a regiment for a month. The only possible way to get to it with a force is to follow the creek bed from its head, some five miles west at the edge of the prairie.

Alcohol and Childhood.

"Alcohol and Childhood" is the title of a pamphlet issued by the C. E. S., giving the report of an afternoon conference held in last June. The Duke of Westminster presided, and many eminent medical gentlemen took part by speech or lecture. Sir Henry Thompson expressed the opinion that "ill-health in later years is largely due to a life of conformity to the error of regarding alcohol as a necessary article of diet; and one of the first duties of a parent is to secure his offspring from needless evils of that kind. To say nothing of the evil associated therewith, not less but more important." Among other cases, Dr. Thomas More Madden speaks of a boy of eight admitted into a Dublin hospital suffering from delirium tremens, and of three children, under 11 years of age, reeling drunk out of a public house on a Sunday afternoon. Alcoholic tendencies may be inherited, but need not be developed, and it is physiologically wrong as well as morally unjustifiable ever to allow a healthy child to taste alcohol in any form. Dr. Barlow (of University College and Children's Hospital) related instances of child diseases traceable to administration of alcohol, and Dr. Clement Dukes showed that beer is a drug which deadens the will power, and excites animal instincts in the young. Its relation, therefore, to immorality is most momentous. - Montreal Star.

Private Detectives.

There will be introduced in the state legislature in the early part of the approaching session a bill which will have a very considerable influence on a flourishing industry in this city. This bill will aim a very decisive blow at the private detective agencies in the state, as well as those other organizations which are closely allied to them.

The bill was first talked of during the recent labor troubles, when the New York Central railroad company employed a number of Pinkerton men to guard its property and to act as private police. At the time the question was raised whether the company had the right to employ such a force, inasmuch as they had not exhausted the resources of either the city, county or state governments. Besides those are included in the proposed measure those associations or societies which have most of their influence in the work of one man, somewhat in the category of the societies headed by Mr. Anthony Comstock and Mr. Britton. The promoters of this special legislation declare that all of these forms of special police are foreign to the spirit of the constitution of the state, and that they have been exceedingly harmful to the legitimate enforcement of the law by the sworn servants of the people who have been authorized to enforce it. - New York Herald.

K. D. O. What is it?

Buffalo Bill's Fiasco.

The daily papers have given ludicrous accounts of Buffalo Bill's expedition "in ball dress" to capture Sitting Bull. A valued correspondent, resident in Dakota, gives this explanation of the foehardy performance: "Buffalo Bill received his orders from General Miller to make the attempted capture when he had been drinking heavily. When Buffalo Bill and his two white companions reached Fort Yates, they were in the midst of a protracted spree, too drunk to realize the utter impossibility of the proposed undertaking. Sitting Bull had mounted scouts every two miles in every direction from his camp, and the 'insiders' would never have reached him alive. They would simply have been killed, a general uprising precipitated, and all unprotected whites on the reservation, as well as settlers on the borders, would have been massacred. Buffalo Bill is the person who averted this awful calamity, by securing the withdrawal of Buffalo Bill before he reached the hostile camp. Bill's equipment for the capture of Sitting Bull consisted of a two-horse spring wagon in which was a full supply of whiskey, two white men, both drunk and two sober Indians as escorts. Major McLauglin, seeing the danger, telegraphed General Miller, begging him to withdraw Buffalo Bill, but he would not. He then telegraphed President Harrison, and the great originator of the Wild West Show was, by the President's orders, overtaken and recalled when within seventeen miles of Sitting Bull." - Chicago Signal.
