Till about two o'clock in the morning.

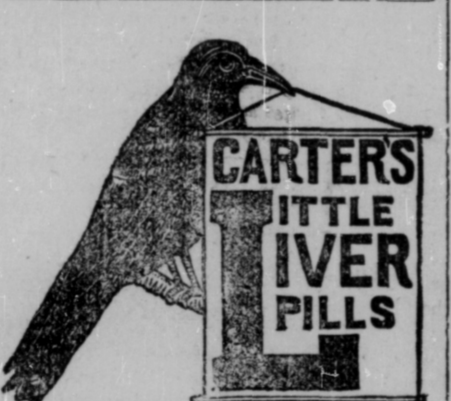
This will give, Sir, a chance to the poor countrymen

BLUE NOSES.

Origin of the Term Applied to the Good People of Nova Scotia.

ANNAPOLIS, N. S., May 29.—Conflicting stories are told to explain the origin of the term "Blue Noses," as applied to Nova Scotians. Colored Men Lynched

DIAZ, Mexico, May 27.—There is great excitement in the town of San Diaz, ten miles from here, over the lynching of seven colored laborers on the Mexican Central railway. Jose Sano, a Spanish negro, attempted to assault the wife of Senor Duply, a ranch owner, and, escaping from the plantation, was tracked by bloodhounds and in company with nine others was captured in a hut on the river bank opposite Eagle Pass. The regulators did not attempt to prove the guilt of any of the negroes, but hanged three of them and shot four more who were trying to escape. The officials are swearing in deputies as race trouble is threatened in the colored quarter. Four of the negroes killed are Americans and have all served sentences in the Texas penitentiary.

Britain's Navy.

WASHINGTON, May 27.—The bureau of naval intelligence has issued a translation of a paper by Constructor Sussenguth, of the German navy, giving a comparative sketch of the navies of the world, with their increases during the next three years so far as provided for at present. One of the most remarkable statements of the writer is that England, on the completion of ships now under construction for her navy, will be in a condition to meet the combined navies of any two of the other powers of the world. It is also stated that England has under construction, and to be completed in the next three years, vessels that alone will be more than equal to the total German navy as it will stand at the end of 1903. A note by the naval intelligence bureau says that this English flotilla now under construction will exceed the American navy, built and building by over 100,000 tons displacement.
