Why Not Form A Club?

It is fast approaching the time of year when the Junior Clubs in the Province should be thinking about reorganizing for the coming season. If the Clubs are going to fulfill their purpose of study, as well as have demonstrations, it is very necessary that they be reorganized and prepared to begin a series of study periods beginning in January. The Provincial Department of Agriculture would be pleased to hear from any new districts that might be contemplating the formation of a Club, and the Agricultural Representatives of different Counties would be only too pleased to attend organizational meetings, or give any information required in the formation of Junior Clubs.

This same principle will apply in that any group within the different Counties might wish to hold. This might possibly be a good time to consider the holding of one, two, or three-day Short Courses in different sections of the Province. To be a success these Short Courses should be organized by some community group, after which the Department of Agriculture would give all the assistance possible for the carrying out of such a Course.

Referring again to the Junior Clubs, we trust that the adult directors will do all in their power to have their Clubs reorganized as soon as possible. The cheques for the prize money will be going forward during this week to the Secretaries of the Clubs, and may it be suggested that a meeting be called as soon as possible to distribute this prize money, and at the same time to reorganize for the ensuing year.

the operator. The stamping is done too close to the edge of the ear, too close to the bottom, or too close to the top.

Frequently the calves are recorded before the tattooing is actually done. This is definitely bad. Just one mistake may cause you to lose your calves when they are a few days old and keep an accurate record of the numbers used.

Put your stamp in between the ribs in the center of the ear. Make sure that you are using your correct herd letters. Do the job right and there never will be any question as to the identity of the animals that come from your herd.

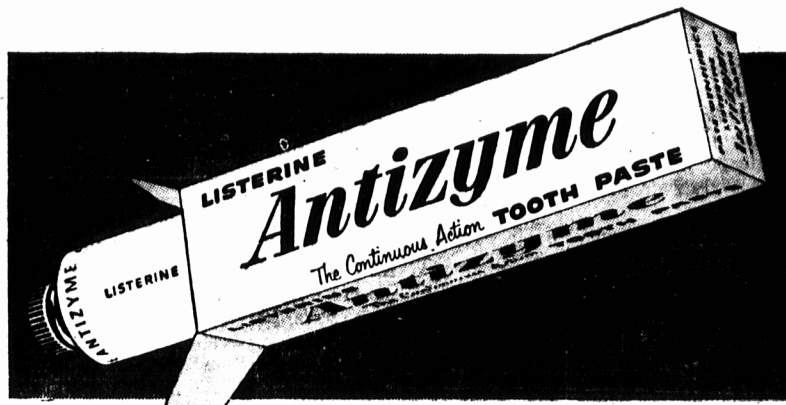
