

Widow Has 8,000 n Back Pension

OTTAWA (CP)—An Ottawa widow Friday learned she is eligible for about \$8,000 in widow's pension from the Canadian pension commission.

Mrs. Irene Massey, 41-year-old estate charwoman, first applied for a pension in 1940 when her husband, Pte. Alfred Massey of the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps was killed in a highway crash.

At the time, her request was refused because her husband was not on active duty at the time of his death.

A pensions commission official today said the commission had reviewed her case and found her eligible for back pension to 1946 when the legislation was amended to provide pensions to servicemen's survivors whether killed on duty or not.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

North dealer.
Neither side vulnerable.

Opening lead—king of diamonds.

The chief components of the squeeze, the most dramatic and most satisfying play in bridge, are three in number.

1. The declarer must have all the remaining tricks but one (except in rare cases).
2. One of the defenders must have the responsibility of guarding two suits or cards.
3. Declarer must have communication with the other hand at the point the squeeze card is played.

There are other factors which sometimes pertain to a squeeze situation, but the three given cover most cases. The problem of how to recognize a squeeze situation is best solved by training oneself to think in terms of a squeeze whenever there is only one loser left.

Thus, after West leads the king of diamonds, declarer notes (No. 1) there are no losers except a heart. He also observes (No. 2) that West, having bid hearts, carries the burden of guarding that suit as well as the ace of diamonds. Declarer also sees (No. 3) that the ace of hearts will eventually act as a communication card to dummy.

Declarer wins the queen of hearts with the king, draws five rounds of trumps and cashes three clubs. At this point he has left a trump and two hearts, while the dummy has A-2 of hearts and queen of diamonds.

West has the J-10 of hearts and ace of diamonds.

The squeeze card, South's last trump, is led and West is in dire straits. He cannot successfully discard a heart or a diamond because a trick is established in dummy in whichever suit West chooses to discard, thereby causing an otherwise sure loser to disappear.

The necessity for all three components to exist can be illustrated if we change West's opening lead to the queen of hearts. As soon as he gets in with a diamond, West leads the jack of hearts to prevent the squeeze position from developing. This defense is effective because communication with dummy is severed by the two heart leads.
