Islanders Open Hockey Season At Sydney Oct. 15

TRURO, N. S., Aug. 5 — (CP) — The Maritime Major Hockey League, with five teams in competition, will start the 1951-52 season at Sydney and Charlottetown, October 15.

No clubs, other than the original five, were represented at the meeting held here Saturday. No applications were received from potential starters. The five clubs—all of which have posted bonds—all of which have posted bonds of \$1,000—are Charlottetown, Sydney, Halifax, Moncton and Saint John.

At the completion of league playoffs, midway through April, the winning team will meet the Quebec League winner in a series for the Alexander Trophy. Playoffs will open at the home of the Maritime winner, April 16.

It was indicated general admission prices for Maritime Major Hockey League games would be raised in most rings of the circuit. The clubs have agreed to pay a visiting club ten cents for every paid admission. This dime will be added to the admission prices.

Ten minutes overtime will be played in the new league.

Moncton Hawks may be forced to play all games away from home for the first week of the schedule. Hawks' delegates doubted if the plant, which is being renovated, would be ready to make ice by October 15.

Ontario Girl Wins Canadian Golf Title

LAVAL-SUR-LE-LAC, Que., Aug. 5 — (CP) — Marlene Stewart, 17-year-old ex-caddie from the Look-out Point Club at Fonthill, Ont., won the Canadian ladies close golf championship Saturday with a 54-hole medallion score of 241.

Her score equalled the tournament record set in 1949 when the championship was changed from match to medal play.

As champion, little Miss Stewart succeeds Mrs. Graeme Pyke of Montreal Whitlock, who won with 246 last year at Winnipeg St. Charles. Mrs. Pyke eliminated herself this year with a first-round 92.

Marlene was 10 strokes over par for the full distance. But in no round did any player equal Laval's difficult par 77, made up of 39-39 for the nines over the men's 36-36 course.

Marlene came to Laval from a recent victory in the Ontario ladies' championship, her first major tournament. She has been playing golf for three years at her home club.

Marlene had to come from behind a two-stroke deficit starting the final round.

Mrs. A. B. Darling, the Montreal Whitlock veteran who led in the first two rounds, slipped Saturday with her poorest golf of the tournament and finished in seventh place.

Two strokes behind Marlene with 243 was Mrs. Peter Patch, a Montreal Whitlock player who now makes her home in Berkeley Calif.

Another stroke back, at 244, was Dainty Chisholm, 21-year-old Quebec champion from Royal Montreal Bracketed at 245 were Babu Davies of Vancouver Marine Drive and Mrs. J. C. Whitelaw of Laval, followed, in sixth place, by Mrs. J. H. Todd of Victoria, with 246.

Falcons In 7-4 Victory Over East End Stars

Northwest Falcons belted out a convincing 7-4 verdict over the East End Stars at Memorial Field yesterday afternoon to pull right back up into a second place tie in the City Baseball League with the Royals, one half a game behind the front running Anchors.
