CPR Said Ready To Give Up Main Line Tax Exemption

OTTAWA (CP)—The CPR is prepared to give up voluntarily its historic exemption from municipal taxes along its main line through the Prairie provinces, Transport Minister Pickersgill told the Commons.

The pledge, contained in a letter from CPR President Ian Sinclair, will become effective during a three-year period after railway legislation now before Parliament has been given final approval.

Mr. Pickersgill also announced that the CNR, which now enjoys exemption from municipal taxation on many of its lines across the country, will begin at the same time to pay municipal tax bills in full. The government-owned railway now makes a grant in lieu of municipal taxes, running about half the tax involved.

Mr. Sinclair's letter said the Prairie tax exemption will be abandoned in three equal annual stages beginning on the first Jan. 1 after passage of the bill.

The privately-owned CPR already pays municipal taxes on its property outside the Prairie region. The CNR pays full municipal taxes only on those lines that it took over from private railway companies when the present CNR network was formed. It doesn't pay on lines the government constructed.

Britain Sells N-Reactor To Romania

LONDON (AP) — Government sources say Britain has sold a nuclear research reactor to Romania in the first deal of its kind across the Iron Curtain.

A British company, the informants say, is negotiating a similar deal with Czechoslovakia.

The experimental reactor purchased by Romania's Institute of Physics, is estimated to have cost approximately \$300,000. British authorities are hopeful the deal may be a prelude to a bigger contract for the sale of a major power-generating reactor, in which the Romanians have been displaying interest for several years.

The independent-minded Communist rulers of Romania in the last three years have approached the United States and Britain on the subject of buying a multi-million-dollar nuclear power reactor which they stressed would be used for peaceful purposes only.

As a result, the British and Americans arranged with their Atlantic allies to remove this type of reactor from the list of goods whose sale to Communist countries is banned.

The reactor now being supplied to Romania was built by the Fairey Engineering group in the face of French, West

German and Swedish counter-bids. Neither the Americans nor the Russians appeared to have displayed much interest in competing.

BOMB KILLS POLICEMEN
BOLZANO, Italy (AP)—Three Italian customs policemen were killed and two others were injured Friday by a bomb which blasted their barracks near the Brenner Pass in this terrorist-troubled frontier region. Police said they believed the mine had been placed during the night by terrorists striking to enforce their demands for autonomy in the Alto Adige (South Tyrol), which Italy took over from Austria after the First World War.

Centennial Gets Praise And Criticism

HALIFAX (CP) — Delegates attending the Canadian Good Roads Association heard Canada's centennial celebrations praised for boosting tourism and criticized for adding to inflationary pressures.

Centennial Commissioner John Fisher told the conference there would be nothing in either the United States or Britain to equal Canada's centennial celebration and "the average Canadian ought to have his head read if he says he wants to go to the United States."

Mr. Fisher said centennial planning had made Canada "regarded as one of the stars of nation-building in the world."

But J. L. Wickwire, Nova Scotia's deputy highways minister, told the conference that basic in preparing for the centennial celebrations is a major factor contributing to inflation.

"Heavy highway expenditure adds its share to the inflationary pressure of all the other things that apparently are be-
