

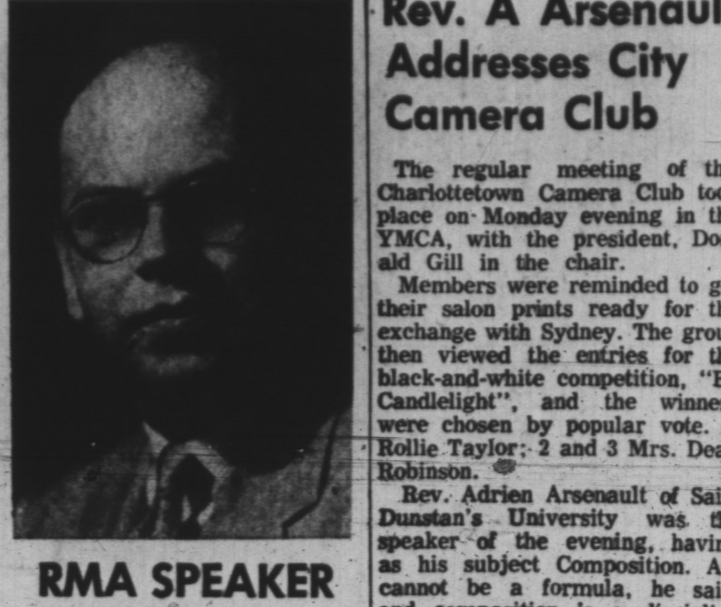

Khrushchev Rattles Sword, Talks Peace

GOLDBERG MOSCOW (AP) — Premier Khrushchev opened the 21st congress of the Soviet Communist party Tuesday by announcing that the Soviet Union has intercontinental ballistic missiles in production. But he said Moscow's main objective is to end the cold war and international tension. He called for a "development of Soviet democracy, the activity and initiative of the broad masses in the building of communism, extension of the functions of public bodies in matters of state importance, increase in the organizational and educational role of the party." Calling on the people for yet harder work to catch up with and surpass capitalist powers, Khrushchev said the day is coming when the Soviet citizen would be the world's best-fed, when there will be no taxes, higher wages and shorter hours, lower prices, plentiful consumer goods and houses. He promised that the real income of the worker would increase 40 per cent during the next seven years of his economic plan. Gross industrial production would be 80 per cent greater by 1965, consumer goods production 62-65 per cent better and agricultural production 70 per cent. The plan, he said, would make the industrial map of Russia, with the eastern regions producing 48 per cent of the country's steel by 1965, as well as a greatly increased share of its coal, copper, aluminum and cement. At the 20th party congress, two years ago, Khrushchev had blasted the "personality cult" of Stalin. Tuesday he paid tribute to the late dictator for having made Russia progress from a backward state to a great power. But some of Stalin's closest aides, who have been banished from high place as an "anti-party" group, came in for a fresh blasting. The party had been compelled to administer a "stern rebuff" to this group he said, and as a result was more united than ever.

Fuel Oil Price Hike Announced. TORONTO (CP)—Imperial Oil Limited announced Tuesday that the price of light fuel oils sold in Ontario, Quebec and the Maritimes is increased by one-half cent a gallon, effective immediately. The price of its fuel oil in Halifax now is 17.2 cents a gallon. "The continued cold weather has put a heavy drain on supplies," a company statement said. "This results in abnormal operations and higher costs." Cent-a-gallon increases were announced previously by Cities Service, British Petroleum, Ontario Gasoline and Oil, Flash Petroleum, British American Oil and McColl-Frontenac.
