DesRoches, president, presided. Following the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting, discussion transpired on the erection and repair of dams in King's County. It was moved that a resolution from the meeting be forwarded to the department to have Crane's Mill site investigated as to a possible dam site. Others proposed were MacNeill's Pond and Dingwell's Mills. In respect to the Department doing this work, Mr. MacNutt, president of the Queen's County branch, said that the department has a standard contract for mill site owners. If the department felt after investigation that the site selected warranted a dam, it must be assured that the site would remain open to public fishing.
