## Ottawa Sources Back U.S. As Sole Nuclear Control

OTTAWA (CP) — There are strong segments of official opinion here which would like to see Britain and France stripped of all nuclear military power. The reason for this thinking, according to complete sources say, is the belief that all Western nuclear capability and control should rest exclusively with the United States.

Sole U.S. nuclear capability and control would simplify disarmament negotiations and force the European members of NATO to concentrate on provision of more conventional weapons.

Some officials here interpret the defence agreement reached last week by President Kennedy and Prime Minister Macmillan at Nassau as the final push by the U.S. to get Britain into Europe.

ENDS ARRANGEMENTS  
The U.S., by declining to proceed with the bomber-borne Skybolt missile which Britain wanted, in effect ended the special Anglo-American defence arrangements which had existed since the early days of the Second World War.

There are defence officials here who say they are convinced Britain and France are hobbled as nuclear powers.

They say Britain's nuclear power as represented by RAF Bomber Command is minuscule in proportion to that of the U.S. and that in any event it is doubtful RAF bombers could ever penetrate Soviet anti-aircraft missile defences.

## Moderate Growth Expected By Pulp, Paper Industry

MONTRÉAL (CP) — Another year of moderate growth for Canada's pulp and paper industry is expected in 1963, R. M. Fowler, president of the Canadian Pulp and Paper Association, says in a year-end review.

The outlook, Mr. Fowler comments, naturally depends to a great extent on the general level of business activity in North America, but he sees the possibility of production increases of about the same order as in 1962.

In 1962 production was at a new high, with an increase of about three per cent over 1961, reflecting increased shipments both in Canada and to export markets. Gross value of production exceeded \$1,600,000,000 of which more than \$1,200,000,000 was exported.

Increase in over-all production and industry operations as a whole continued to average about 85 per cent of capacity. Owing to the large exports, the decline during 1962 in the foreign exchange value of the Canadian dollar was of considerable significance to many producers, Mr. Fowler says, and helped to offset increased costs in several areas.

Final shipment figures are expected to show that production in 1962 was marginally lower than in 1961. However, total shipments were slightly higher, with increases in the domestic market, the United States and Britain more than offsetting declines in some over-

## Remarkable Drop Is Noted In Paralytic Polio Cases

OTTAWA (CP) — A "remarkable drop" in the number of paralytic poliomyelitis cases to 88 in 1962 from 185 in 1961 and 909 in 1960 was reported here in a year-end roundup by the health department.

The report said it appeared that the original Salk vaccine program had been greatly instrumental in reducing morbidity to the 1962 level.

## Hundreds Of Ex-Nazis Remain To Face Trial

COBLENZ, Germany (AP) — The court called a short recess — long enough for a cigarette. Two witnesses had just testified how prisoners of the Nazis were burned alive.

Now the courtroom was empty except for some of the guards and some of the 12 former SS men who didn't want a cigarette.

In one corner of the courtroom, defendant Arthur Wilke stood before a large green map of western Russia.

"I tell you, those Russians were just devilish," Wilke said.
