IN THE SUPREME COURT. In the matter of an Act of the Parliament of Canada, passed in the forty-fifth year of Her present Majesty's reign, chapter 23, intitled an Act respecting Insolvent Banks, Insurance Companies, Loan Companies, Building Societies and Trading Corporations...

THE creditors of the above named Banking Company are required, on or before the TWENTY-FOURTH DAY OF JULY NEXT, (A. D. 1882), to send their names and addresses and the particulars of their debts or claims, and the names and addresses of their Solicitors, if any, to David C.
