Car Ferry Queries Are Answered By Official

William Hayward, president of the Charlottetown Board of Trade, has released a letter from D. V. Gonder, vice-president and general manager, C.N.R., Atlantic Region, in reply to inquiries made by the Board of Trade regarding the Northumberland Strait ferry services.

The letter stated that the Prince Edward Island ferry had suffered rudder damage while negotiating the ice between P. E. I. and Cape Breton, but that this damage was being repaired as quickly as material was received.

The letter continued: "The Prince Edward Island has had all the fire damage repaired and additional fire control devices installed. With these improvements, the vessel can carry a full complement of 704 passengers."

"The railway car deck has had the planking renewed between the rails over the full area so that the vessel now has a capacity of 35 automobiles on the upper deck and 45 automobiles on the railway car deck when railway cars are not being handled."

"So far as M. V. Abegweit is concerned, she too has the entire railway deck planked over and has an automobile capacity on the upper deck of 58 and on the lower deck of 67 when railway cars are not being handled. You asked if we were modifying the laneways for the wider wheel gauges on some 1959 automobile

models; this is being done at the coming spring dry-docking. "I am wondering if this is not an appropriate occasion to remind you of the limitation which is placed upon us by law when railway tank cars or highway tank trucks carrying gasolene and such inflammable liquids are being handled. On any such trip we are not permitted to carry passengers. I mention this because some automobile drivers have been disappointed in not being permitted to embark because of these restrictions on some 'extra' trips."

"Naturally, we are careful to plan the movement of inflammable liquids so that these trips are made when automobile traffic is at a minimum. In fact, the 'gasoline runs' are made only late at night after all normal scheduled runs are completed. Of course, when railway or other requirements demand more than the scheduled trips to be run, highway traffic is always welcome on these extra trips, provided inflammable liquids are not being handled at the same time."

"Our new spring and summer timetable pamphlet is not yet in our hands or I would send you copies. However, we expect that when the peak of traffic builds up, the M. V. Abegweit and the S. S. Prince Edward Island, running opposite each other, will make ten round trips each day."
