**HALIFAX (CP)** — The weather office says late Wednesday evening skies were cloudy over most of the Maritimes and scattered showers were being reported from Prince Edward Island. Temperatures at 10 p.m. were in the high 30s in Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island and in the low 30s in New Brunswick.

An intensifying disturbance developing off Cape Hatteras late Wednesday evening is expected to move rapidly northeastward. It will bring rain to the western portion of the district this morning with the rain spreading as far east as Cape Breton Island by late this evening.

 Prince Edward Island: Cloudy with a few sunny intervals rain beginning in the evening; little change in temperature; light winds. Low-high at Charlottetown 34 and 42.
