PRINCE ALFRED'S FUNERAL.

Impressive Service Held on the Arrival of the Remains.

The body of Prince Alfred, only son and heir of the Duke of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, who died at Meran, in the Austrian Tyrol, on Feb. 6th, was placed in the vaults of the Fridenstein church. Twelve non-commissioned officers bore the coffin on their shoulders from the train to the hearse. The procession to the church was then formed, headed by a battalion of troops. A footman led Prince Alfred's horse behind the hearse, beside which walked 24 non-commissioned officers and four chamberlains. The Duke of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha, with his sons-in-law, Prince Ferdinand of Romania, Grand Duke Ernest Louis of Hesse, and Prince Ernest, Prince hereditary of Hohenzollern-Langenburg, followed the hearse, and then came representatives of the foreign courts. The route of the procession was lined with local guilds and school children. The Duchess of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha and the ladies of the princely and royal families met the procession at the church, where brief services were held.

A CLEVER RUSSIAN.

He Found a Method of Beating His Persian Creditor.

It is against the laws, or at least the custom, which is just as firm, to touch a creditor who takes this means of collecting money, so the count could not throw him out. He thought over the matter, and one morning he sent for a lot of masons. Then he ordered them to build a wall around the dervish, who was sitting in the middle of the room. The dervish watched them placidly at first, but when the wall grew and it became apparent that it would be completed soon he jumped over it, ran away and has not been seen since. They say that the count is the first man in Teheran who has beaten a creditor of this kind.
