Gets Prompt

Continued from page 1 Europe who were afraid and who asked us to do so. "That fear is, I imagine, a fear which cannot be allayed by new words and new promises, because the fear was inspired by a country Soviet Russia which was already bound by the United Nations charter not to use force against the territorial integrity or independence of any state."

Molotov Unperturbed

Unperturbed by the Western rebuff, Molotov insisted that the conference go on talking about his European security plan. The Western ministers, who again take up the question of Asian peace conferences in a secret session with Molotov today, will decide by Friday whether to devote more discussion time to European security at the Russian's behest.

For two days, they have been trying to get Molotov's agreement to stop the debate about Germany and security after calling it hopeless "at this particular conference."

Molotov wrapped Wednesday's security scheme in the trappings of "Europe for the Europeans."

Eden found it an unacceptable Kremlin distortion of the Monroe doctrine, by which the United States once set out to keep European great powers from mixing in the Americas.

Molotov's plan called for nearly all occupation armies to get out of Germany within six months. Any of the occupying powers could re-enter Germany with troops "in case the security of either part of Germany is threatened."

Says Unity Buried

Eden pointed out that while the plan would bind NATO states to renounce their alliance, it would "allow Russia to maintain her alliances in the East with other Communist nations."

He protested that Molotov had buried the West's plan for uniting Germany by a free election and substituted recognition of the rival East and West German republics as members of the new European security bloc.

"We must agree on Germany before moving on to wider fields," Eden added. "The plan suggested today could not possibly form the basis of a European security system."

Bidault commented that Russia seemed to envisage a division of Germany "for another 50 years."

"The Soviet delegate has spoken a great deal of the need to destroy the Western bloc, but he offered no parallel loosening of the Eastern bloc, which was formed a long time before," Bidault said.

Wildgeese In Need Of Grain

Reports from a reliable source indicate that a flock of between 300 and 400 wildgeese at Rollo Bay are finding themselves in difficulties. Farmers in the vicinity refrained from feeding the birds in the hope they would become discouraged and leave for a warmer climate. After the blizzard in late January many geese were observed staggering over the snow covered fields. Farmers in the district have been digging down deeply into their grain supplies and the geese are responding in a most encouraging manner. However, it requires a lot of grain to keep a flock of that size going and it is understood that Keith Matheson, Souris, president King's County Branch Fish and Game Association has been approached for assistance in this worthy cause. Once geese remain past a certain dead-line they'll starve or freeze to death. A mild spell will open up the channels and runs in Rollo Bay and tend to relieve the situation. Bell grass is prevalent in the area if the birds have access to it.
