

A Brutal Exhibition.

THE SULLIVAN-MITCHELL CONTEST—THE FORMER DECLARED THE WINNER.

An immense crowd assembled in Madison Square Garden, New York, on the 14th inst., to witness the glove contest between Sullivan, the champion of America, and Mitchell, who was introduced as champion of England.

The work was earnest from the start. Sullivan went viciously at Mitchell and the latter in getting out of his way fell twice. Watching his opportunity he got in a quack blow and Sullivan went down. He got up and closed with Mitchell and there was close fighting till time was called and the men ordered to break.

The latter sprang lightly to his feet, but was knocked down and got up dazed. Sullivan then pressed him and drove him to the ropes again and threw him clear over them, the Englishman falling with his head down and his feet sticking straight up in the air.

Sullivan was officially declared the winner and received 60 per cent, and Mitchell 40 per cent, of the gate money, which amounted to \$10,000.
