Islander Among 88 Grads Of Psychiatric Nursing Course

MONTREAL (Special) — The Verdun Protestant hospital is the site of a course for psychiatric nursing carried on by the nursing assistant as part of the treatment. The need for trained nursing assistants grows constantly as the hospital's services expand to its new children's services (the unit for emotionally disturbed adolescents and the six-building unit expected to care for some 200 mentally retarded children) are just now getting underway and these services, along with regular hospital needs, of 150 men and women interesting and challenging areas of work; where further training and professional study in the hospital is available to those who want it. Enrollment for the next class in January is open now and students are encouraged to make application immediately. Students receive a weekly allowance for board and room and board in the hospital residence and are supplied with uniforms. Regular salary commences upon graduation. Admission requirements are for grade nine schooling and up, although a high school diploma is an asset. To become a psychiatric nursing assistant does not entail the long years of training to become a registered nurse, yet graduates are finding a worthwhile and important nursing career caring for dependent people, plus the inner satisfaction and social recognition attained as they take their place in the field of psychiatric treatment programs. The course is one of Canada's foremost health programs.

Verdun Protestant Hospital, one of the leading teaching hospitals caring for the mentally ill, recognizes the contribution being made by the trained psychiatric nursing assistant, which has become important to the hospital's psychiatric team. The hospital looks to the nursing assistant to assume responsibility for the care of the mentally-ill in a way different from that of general hospital routine as the patient learns to become independent through reactivation and re-education.

Miss Nessa Leckie, R.N., director of nursing education, states that she is particularly well pleased with her graduates this year. She believes the general high calibre of the students, their educational background, and their interest in the profession in this area of nursing, lends additional prestige to the program of training and the psychiatric nursing assistant's role in the hospital.

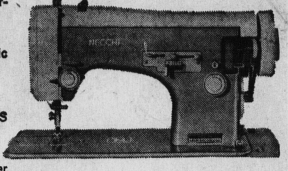

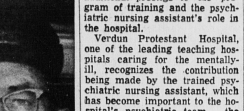
Presbyterian Church Plans Special Service

SUMMERSIDE — A special service of thanksgiving commemorating the first meeting of the Fathers of Confederation will be held in old, historic Summerside Presbyterian Church at both morning (11 a.m.) and evening (7 p.m.) services, Sunday, Oct. 25th.

Commercial Use Possibly Found For Peat Moss

There is a possible commercial use for peat moss from the Black Banks area of the province. There is a good possibility that it can be used in the process of pelleting iron ore for the steel industry.

Industry and Natural Resources Minister Leo Rossiter said Thursday that a peat moss this morning that peat moss was tested as a binder for pelleting by the Ontario Research Foundation. "The moss," he said, "has the required content of humic acid needed in the binding process."

Mr. Rossiter said further research into the economic aspects of supplying moss for the process is being carried out.

MONTREAL (CP) — A monument to road pioneers is to be built beside the Trans-Canada Highway on Montreal Island, Quebec Roads Minister Bernard Pinard announced.

He said a contest is being launched for the design of the monument. It is open to all Canadian architects and tradesmen.

The Quebec government will donate a "substantial" cash award to the contest winner, he told the Canadian Good Roads Association.

The monument will be set up on the northern exit of the Louis-Hippolyte Lafontaine bridge-tunnel, now under construction, which will carry the Trans-Canada Highway under Montreal's harbor.

'Smoking, Health' Kits Being Distributed Here

An educational program outlining the effects of cigarette smoking on health, aimed at the young people of the province, has been started by the department here.

"Smoking and Health" information kits are being distributed to the province's school-teachers and doctors, according to Dr. Hubert MacNeill, minister of health.

About 2,000 of the kits are now available. In addition, about 10,000 booklets, "Smoking and Cancer," are to be distributed to children through the schools.

Dr. MacNeill said "the kits have been prepared in response to inquiries from teachers, students and other members of the public seeking information on the hazards of smoking."

"Contents of the kit have been drawn from a variety of sources and closely reflect the views of the officials, voluntary and professional health agencies represented at the Canadian conference on smoking and health, held in Ottawa last year.

"It is a teaching aid in a nationwide program to alert Canada on the subject and has been approved by a committee representing the provincial health departments and the department of national health and welfare."

Dr. MacNeill said the information kits are also available from the Charlottetown office of the department, without charge.
