Q: Is there any truth to the rumors that you won't be returning next year.

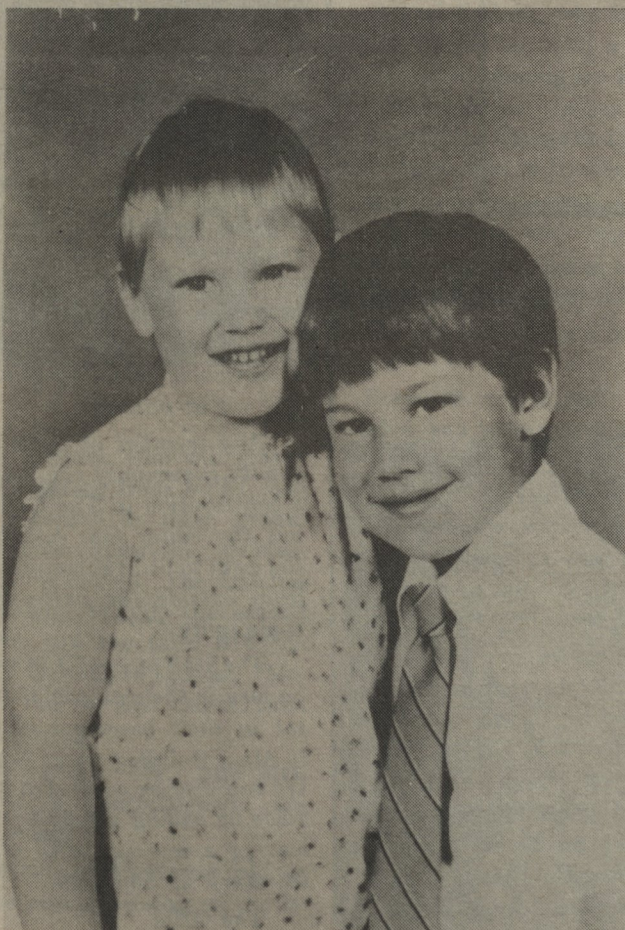
A: This place was never meant for me. I know that now. UPEI and I are better off without each other. I don't like most people
