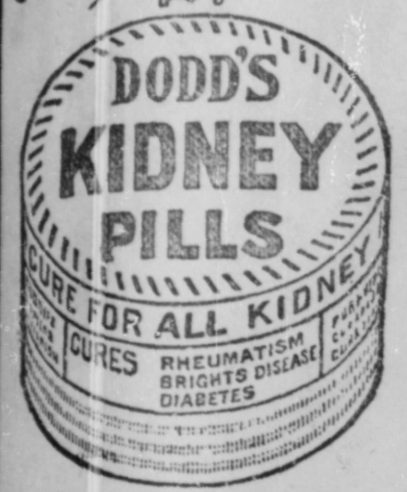

WILL THIS CURE THE GOLD FEVER?—Mr. Thomas E. Murphy, of South Shore, received a letter a few days ago from his son, Wellington, who has joined the army of workers in the Klondike gold fields. It says:—"Arrived at Athol city on March 15th, after five weeks of severe hardship and privation. Weather very cold, thermometer registering from 45 to 48 below zero during first week of March. Not much show of mining here as yet as weather is too severe for anything to be done. I have taken up some claims but cannot tell if they will be successful. Wages here are about \$5 a day, but those who come without supplies have to pay \$4 of that for board and lodging, and the man who indulges in the luxury of tobacco has nothing to his credit. I am in the place such a short time that I can hardly give any opinion about it, but will write particulars later."
