PRINCE COUNTY.

DISTRICT No. 1.

Comprising Townships Nos. 1, 2 and 3.

Table listing road and bridge projects for District No. 1, including items like 'Road from Charles Cannon's towards P. Cahill's' and 'Road from Skinner's Pond to Horse Head'.

DISTRICT No. 2.

Comprising Townships Nos. 4, 5 and 6.

Table listing road and bridge projects for District No. 2, including items like 'From James Sullivan's, Lot 4, to line of Lot 3' and 'Road from Alexander McDonald's to Sand Hills'.

DISTRICT No. 3.

Comprising Townships Nos. 7, 8 and 9.

Table listing road and bridge projects for District No. 3, including items like 'O'Leary road, from Lot 8 to line of Lot 6' and 'Road from McDonald's to Lot 7 road'.

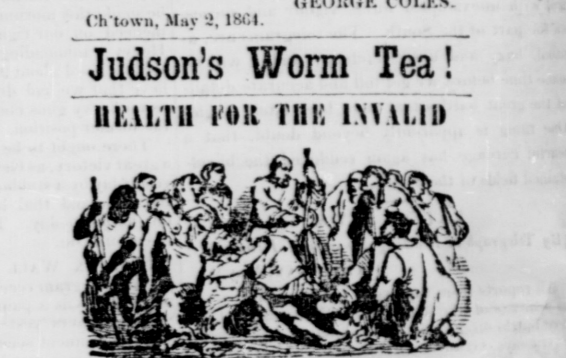
