THE GOOD EGG

With Grade A large eggs at floor prices levels and a very wide margin between that and the price of B Grade eggs there is every excuse for moralizing upon the importance and value of producing good quality eggs.

At the present time egg markets are glutted practically everywhere, the Government of course purchases the surplus Grade A large and thus stabilizes the price but lower grade eggs are difficult to move, this is always the case when a good quality product is offered at a reasonable price—there are few takers for the lower grades. The egg trade is having a serious problem in finding storage for eggs and a more serious one in trying to figure out what to do with B's and C's.

While the price of A's is not high yet it is certainly much better than that of the lower grades. It is not the intention to offer advice in this connection other than to suggest that a good hard look at egg quotations might prove profitable for producers with a high percentage of low grade eggs.

HORNETS NEST

The announcement from Ottawa that price supports would lower the price of milk for powder and butter and of the intention to use efficiency payments in hogs and eggs stirred up very strong feelings in the province of Ontario. The Ontario Federation of Agriculture accused the Federal Government of "price fixing activities" through its new policy of deficiency payments and consumer subsidies.

A telegram to this effect was sent to the Prime Minister on May 7. Milk producers and hog producers argued that their industries would be crippled by the change in policy and that their organized marketing program would be severely handicapped by a reduction in supports and direct subsidies to consumers.

The Ontario Milk Producers and Co-ordinating Board expects dairy farmers to lose a million dollars this year as the result of changes and does not expect the consumers to be much better off. The President of the Ontario Federation stated that Ontario farmers' orderly marketing program could be seriously threatened by Ottawa's decision to follow that the President termed an "antiquated cheap food policy."

Even the cheese producers who will get a higher price than last year weren't happy as they do not expect the consumer to benefit through lower prices and suggested that the Government would be spending a lot more money on cheese than was previously the case.

CURSED BE THE MAN
Years ago we quite often heard the quotation, "Cursed be the man that putteth the bottle to his neighbour's lips". Often coupled with the suggestion however that the reference was to the empty bottle. Be that as it may bottles can be a real hazard and one sitting on the window sill in the sun is reported to have started a disastrous fire in Kings County last Sunday morning. Apparently if conditions are right a bottle can concentrate and focus sunlight with an intensity that will start a fire.

We have also heard of another fire that was caused by broken glass from a window lying on straw. If there is a moral to this business of bottles it would appear to be that there is some risk involved in leaving them in places where they will concentrate the sunlight on inflammable material. Therefore we suggest that bottles be forthwith removed to safer places.

POTATO HAPPINESS
Those fortunate growers who have potatoes to sell at the present time will reap a much better harvest than was the case earlier in the season. There is a great

difference between \$200 and 75 cents. A great deal of difference for the farmer who has them to sell and certainly so far as the economy of the province is concerned. With a considerable quantity still on hand in the province the increase in prices will mean real encouragement for many growers.

LONG NIGHT
Difference in view points on time in this province were once again emphasized by the Alberton resident who referred to 6:30

a.m. as being "The middle of the night". For lobster fishermen and farmers at this time of the year 6:30 a.m. is closed to being the middle of the day.

In any event if we can not agree on what is day and what night there does not seem to be much prospect of agreement on the merits of fast time.

CATTLE SUPPORT
Beef is one of the products which comes under a mandatory floor price. However the floor price has not been in operation for some time due to the fact that the market is well above the floor. Over the last ten years the average price for good steers on the Toronto market is \$22.28. The floor would therefore be \$17.80 per hundredweight. At the moment there does not appear to be much prospect of good steers going that low for some time.

In the case of lambs the support price at Toronto is \$19.55 per hundredweight. In the case of both steers and lambs the market price is \$25.00 per hundredweight.

SUN AND SHADOW
Starting with November during the past six months has had considerably above the average hours of sunlight. Over the past fifty years this six month period has averaged approximately 625 hours of sunlight or an average of slightly over 100 hours per month. For the past six months the total has been 830 hours or almost 140 hours per month.

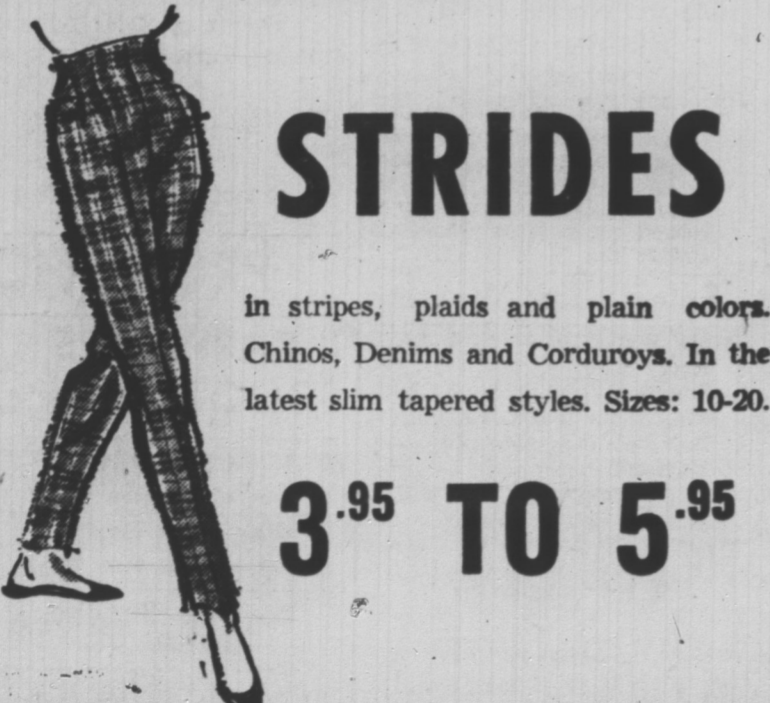
