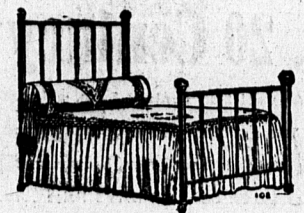

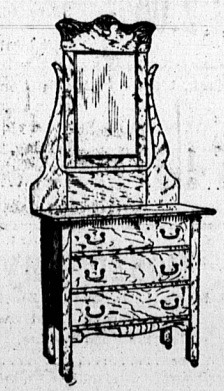

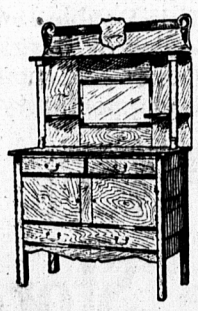

VANCOUVER—Strawberries 24 pint crates British Columbia \$2 to \$2.75. Apples No. 1 Winesap and Newtowns \$3.75. Potatoes locals \$20 to \$30 per ton. Interior \$35 to \$40 per ton. Onions 5 cents per lb. Apricots California 26 boxes 1st, to 14th 17 strawberries 4 potatoes 2 cabbage 2 lettuce 1 apples 3 tomato 3 3 onions. STRAWBERRIES Reports received from all markets to which Ontario berries have been shipped state that they are arriving for the most part in very poor condition. The boxes are only partly filled and contain much green and dirty fruit. The imports into Canada of U. S. strawberries this year have more than doubled those for a number of years past and the fruit—clean, well colored and in well filled boxes, brought good prices throughout the season. Consumers are therefore apparently prepared to pay a fair price for good well coloured berries which have been properly picked and packed in boxes which arrive on the market properly filled. They are again, however demonstrating their unwillingness to buy except at a very great discount the majority of local shipments received to date. The Fruit Branch strongly urges strawberry growers to give more attention to the picking, packing and shipping of their fruit. It pays to put enough berries in each box to assure that when they arrive on the market they will not have settled lower than the top of the box. G. E. McINTOSH Acting Commissioner
