NOTES FROM THE CAPITAL.

Officials on the Wing—Field-
ing Leaves for England.

OTTAWA, Sept. 4.—Frank Pedely, the
newly appointed commissioner of immigra-
tion, assumed his duties today. He and
Deputy Minister Smart have gone east on
a tour of inspection of the immigrant
agencies. Before their return to Ottawa
they will visit Halifax and St. John.

Mr. Mulock contemplates changes in
the Post Office inspectorships. Mr. Baker,
the Toronto inspector has been superannu-
ated.

shortly to float a loan.

MASSING TROOPS IN INDIA.

Afridis to be Punished.

LONDON, Sept. 4.—Confirmation has
been given a report that the government
has sanctioned the sending of a large expedi-
tion against the Afridis.

General Lockhart left Brindisi, Italy,
yesterday on his way to India, where he
will arrive in good time to
command the expedition to move
in about a fortnight hence. General
Lockhart's skill in border warfare, which
is great, will tend to overawe the tribesmen
who have taken part in the uprising.

AN INTERNATIONAL QUESTION

United States Cruiser in Lake
Erie.

OTTAWA, Sept. 4.—There is considerable
comment in official circles over the con-
templated action of the United States
Government in sending the Cruiser Yantic
to Lake Erie in violation of the treaty of
Ghent. It is said that the object of the
vessel is to serve for the instruction of all
purposes for the Michigan naval brigade.

Firing of Provincial Teams.

LONDON, Sept. 4.—The Merchants' cup
for the provincial teams of eight men went
to Ontario with 707 points. The second
prize, \$40, to Nova Scotia and the third
prize to New Brunswick.

MONTREAL, Sept. 4.—Cousirat left here
for Charlottetown yesterday to attend the
bicycle races on Labor Day. He will race
a match with the winner of each bicycle
event.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

Boston, Sept. 2.—The steamship Cana-
da brought eight hundred and twenty-
nine passengers to-day, the largest number
from Europe on any regular liner on a
regular trip ever brought into this port.

TRURO, Sept. 2.—An explosion occurred
this evening at the Chambers electric light
works. The fine new engine lately put in
was ruined. None of the employees were
injured, though there were some narrow
escapes.

LONDON, Sept. 2.—The thunder storms
and heavy rains which have prevailed all
the week throughout Great Britain and
the continent culminated yesterday even-
ing in a severe gale which did much
damage to trees and crops, resulted in
minor shipping disaster in the English
channel, and flooded many parts of the
Thames valley.

OTTAWA, Sept. 2.—The detachment of
northwest mounted police which is to try
the overland route to the Klondike, leave
Edmonton to-morrow. It consists of one
inspector and five men. The men will
travel on horseback, supplies being taken
on pack horses, and as this is the first
attempt to reach the Yukon country in
this manner the experience of the detach-
ment will be of great service to persons
seeking information about this route.

MONTREAL, Sept. 3.—Though the ship-
ment of apples from this port to Europe
is by no means up to last season consider-
able fruit has gone forward when the ear-
liness of the season is taken into considera-
tion. Up to the 1st of September 1,770
barrels have been shipped from this port
to England, as against 13,693 barrels for
the corresponding dates last year. The
prices, however, are much better, in fact,
upward of a hundred per cent. in advance
of last year. For instance a shipment
recently sent out from New York returned
back at the New York dock \$1.59, \$1.93
\$1.82 and \$1.87 per barrel for Duchesse,
while last year the net return was between
50 and 70 cents per barrel.

BUFFALO, N. Y. Sept. 3.—An official
call has been issued by Miss Frances Wil-
lard for the twenty fourth annual conven-
tion of the National Woman's Christian
Temperance Union in Buffalo. The
convention will meet in Music Hall from
October 29 until November 2. The fourth
biennial convention of the World's W. C.
T. U. immediately precedes this convention
in Toronto. Before that the annual con-
vention of the W. C. T. U. of the Dominion
of Canada will be held. These three
conventions will be among the greatest
gatherings of women ever held. Among
the prominent members in attendance at
Buffalo will be Lady Somerset, who will
preach the annual sermon on October 31.
A big committee is planning for the enter-
tainment of the visitors and the other
detail work incident to the convention.
